This AGREEMENT, entered into this $\underline{q}_{\bar{\tau}\mu}$ day of October, 1981, by and between the County of Nassau, by and through the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, and the Town of Callahan, by and through the Town Council of Callahan, who, for and in consideration of the amounts of moneys and services herein below expressed, agree as follows:

1.) NASSAU COUNTY agrees to perform certain work, as listed below in the Town of Callahan:

a. Reconstruction of Dixie Avenue beginning at Brown Street and running to Mikler Street. The reconstruction will include surfacing with asphaltic concrete. Approximate cost for reconstruction is \$5,000.00. Approximate cost for surfacing is \$1,200.00.

b. Preparing and finishing the base of a tennis court located at Ewing Road.

Approximate cost for preparing and finishing the base will be approximately \$5,000.00; Approximate cost for surfacing will be \$2,700.00

2.) Upon certification of the County Engineer that the work is completed and upon submission of an invoice, the TOWN OF CALLAHAN shall forward the full payment of said invoice to the COUNTY OF NASSAU within five (5) days of the receipt of same.

3.) The Town of Callahan agrees to indemnify the County of Nassau for any liability for any damages of any kind whatsoever attributable to said County during construction of said road unless such damages be caused by the negligent acts of the County of Nassau, its employees or agents.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this $\underline{\exists} r d$ day of $\underline{\leq} r r d r$ 1981, by and between the COUNTY OF NASSAU, by and through the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, and the TOWN OF CALLAHAN, by and through the TOWN COUNCIL OF CALLAHAN, who, for and in consideration of the amounts of moneys and services herein below expressed, agree as follows:

1.) Nassau County agrees to perform certain road work, as listed below, on the following streets in the Town of Callahan:

1. Brown Street from Fifth Street to Mickler Street construction and asphaltic concrete surfacing. The approximate cost for construction is \$12,000.00, and the approximate cost for surfacing is \$3,600.00.

2. Dixie Avenue - repair and resurfacing. Approximate cost at this time not available without additional investigation.

3. Booth Street - resurfacing and subgrade repair. Resurfacing costs approximately \$14,600.00; subgrade repair costs approximately \$2,000.00.

4. Brown Street from U.S. 301 to Green Street - resurfacing. Approximate cost \$1,700.00.

5. Brown Street from Green Street to Dixie Avenue construction and surfacing. Approximate cost for construction \$5,000.00; approximate cost for surfacing \$1,200.00.

2.) The County Engineer will be required to do additional investigative work on Dixie Avenue to determine the extent and the approximate costs of the work to be done. The County Engineer would advise both public bodies of the approximate costs for the work, and, upon approval by both of the work and the amount, then Dixie Avenue would be repaired and resurfaced.

3.) The approximate total cost of the road work, excluding Dixie Avenue, will be THIRTY-NINE THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTY DOLLARS (\$39,760.00), said price not to vary more than \$3,000.00 upward.

4.) Upon certification of the County Engineer that the work is completed and upon submission of an invoice, the Town of Callahan shall forward the full payment of said invoice to the County of Nassau within five (5) days of the receipt of same.

5.) The Town of Callahan agrees to indemnify the County of Nassau for any liability for any damages of any kind whatsoever attributable to said County during construction of said road unless such damages be caused by the negligent acts of the County of Nassau, its employees or agents.

Commissioner Hodges made motion that the Board approve this application and instruct the Chairman to sign Ordinance No. 81-20, rezoning this property from Open Rural to Commercial Intensive. Motion seconded by Commissioner Claxton and voted unanimously.
