



AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this <u>lst</u> day of <u>October</u>, 1975 between the City of Jacksonville, a municipal corporation acting through its Board of Library Trustees, hereinafter called the CITY, and Nassau County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter called the COUNTY;

WITNESSETH:

- 1. <u>Consideration</u>. The County agrees to pay the City
 Fifty Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-three Dollars (\$50,363.00), plus
 Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00) to be received from the City of
 Fernandina Beach and all State Aid monies as the cost of library service
 to be provided by the City for the year ending September 30, 1976. The
 County will pay the City in the following manner: Five Thousand Dollars
 (\$5,000.00) in November, 1975, Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00)
 in January, 1976, and Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-three
 Dollars (\$25,363.00) prior to June 1, 1976, and all library monies from
 Fernandina Beach and State Aid as soon as they are received.
- 2. <u>Jacksonville Library Use</u>. The City agrees that residents of Nassau County shall be entitled to the use of the main City public library, and any of the City branch libraries without charge, subject to all the laws, rules and regulations prescribed for the City of Jacksonville users of the library service.
- 3. <u>Bookmobile Service</u>. The City will provide bookmobile circulating Library Service to communities in the County at least once every two weeks under rules and regulations, together with the itinerary for the circulating library, which may be prescribed and decided by the City, upon consultation with the Nassau County Advisory Committee.

- 4. <u>Book Collection</u>. The City will purchase books for the County within the limitation of funds provided in this agreement and the books so purchased will become the property of the County. The City will loan an additional 1,000 volumes for public use in Nassau County during the period of this agreement.
- 5. Equipment and Expense. The City agrees that in addition to the books described in paragraph 4, the furniture and equipment purchased for the County libraries, upon termination of this Agreement will become the property of the County. The determination of books to be included in the permanent book collection shall be by the City, but the advice of the County Library Advisory Committee shall be considered by the City. Expenses incident to the busing of library facilities shall be borne by the County, but the City will pay from the funds provided herein the expense for rent, electricity, heat, telephone, custodial services and supplies for the Fernandina Beach Library.
- 6. Management and Cooperation. The City shall manage and operate the library service provided, under the direction of the Director of the Jacksonville Public Library. The City agrees to consult with the County in the execution of this contract and to admit to representation upon its Board of Library Trustees a representative of the County Library Advisory Committee, who shall participate, without voting, in the affairs of the Board.
- 7. Records Kept. The City shall furnish its annual audit to the County, and shall report progress in library service in the County. A detailed record shall be kept by the City of all properties, including books, acquired for the County community branch libraries, and shall be available to both parties.

8. Staff Personnel. The County may, with the prior approval of the City, employ personnel to staff community libraries which may be established. In the event personnel are employed, the City will reimburse the County for the salaries paid to those personnel. No personnel so employed shall be considered employees of the City or have any rights or privileges under any Civil Service law or pension law of the City.

- 9. Regional Library Program. The parties intend to procure and provide all services for a Regional Library Program, and, as financial and other circumstances permit, to provide library materials, staff and services, according to accepted library standards, where they are needed, and in places and during hours where and when they may be available to all persons in Nassau County.
- 10. <u>Future Service Plan.</u> At least 30 days prior to the expiration of this Agreement, the City shall furnish a plan of future service to the County Library Advisory Committee and to the Board of County Commissioners based on the experience of this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Insurance</u>. The County agrees to maintain during the life of this Agreement all risk insurance, subject to standard exclusions, on the community library buildings, if any, and their contents except books. The City shall provide insurance against loss or damage to books.
- 12. Effective Date. This Agreement becomes effective upon the execution by the parties to provide library service during the period from October 1, 1975 to Setpember 30, 1976 and shall remain in effect unless cancelled in accordance with the terms of Section 13.
- 13. Cancellation. Either party may cancel this Agreement by written notice delivered to the other, but notice must be delivered at least ninety (90) days prior to October 1st of each year, to take effect on October 1st. In the event the City shall cancel this contract, any unused portion of payment made to it by the County shall be returned to the County.

RE: ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1976

Once again I am happy to report the progress of our library services to the Commissioners of Nassau County.

This past year has seen much activity of the building committee. Members are: Mrs. Gordon Butler, Mrs. Edgar Saunderson, Mrs. Virginia Grazier and Mrs. Franklin Jones, chairperson. Mr. Harry Brinton, Jacksonville's librarian, and Mr. David Coonrod, Architect, serve as consultants. The library program was written by this group and is currently being carried out. The plans, and each change of plans, have been studied, recommendations made and presented to the City Commission. With the good news of the availability of Federal Funds, the plan was ready to put into action. Our new library truly represents a cooperation of all of these people and many more. Next year we will hope to have you hold your May meeting in the new library, and it will not be necessary to close the library to public use.

I have also been working closely with Mrs. Willye Dennis, Director of the LOOP program for Jacksonville--now to be extended to Nassau County. The Library Operated Outreach Program will send a van and personnel to the schools of Nassau County. The City of Fernandina Beach will not be included in this program since the library is located here. A grant of an additional \$60,000 has been received by the Jacksonville Library to pay for this service. The van has been ordered, the Superintendent of Schools, Principals, and Media Specialists have been contacted in these schools. We hope to be able to inaugurate this program by August or September of this year.

During the 1976 circulation of books and materials increased by 1,700 items for a total of 52,000. In addition, the Hilliard Library circulated 5,300 items during the same time period.

On November 3, 1976 the Fernandina Beach Library held an Open House to celebrate the tenth anniversary of library service in Nassau County. Invitations were sent to more than 100 persons who helped in forming the service and continue to support the library program. Mrs. Henry Allison was an honored guest for the occasion and many visitors stopped by for a congratulatory word and a cup of punch.

Annual Report May 10, 1977

The usual programs have been successful—the story hours, the film programs, and the summer reading program for children. We plan to inaugurate additional film programs for adults once we are in the new library and have a separate room in which to show them. This summer the theme for the Reading Program is "Book Trek" Miss Evett Simmons will be in charge.

Book prices continue to rise. Our permanent collection now totals 18,200. We also have 1337 books that we rent (the best sellers), unlimited paperbacks, a small record collection, and 55 magazines and newspapers. The library collection is supplemented by many loans from the Jacksonville collection as well as book loans, xeroxed articles, and reference answers from sources throughout the state.

Do you know how to silver a mirror or the name of Hopalong Cassidy's horse? Who was the Amelia for whom our Island is named? Was she the sister or daughter of George II or George III? How much is the West German mark worth? What's playing on Broadway? What is the new "balloon" look? Recently a couple from Memphis visited us. In the course of conversation, the gentleman mentioned that he was related to Dr. Wellford who died in Fernandina Beach while assisting in the battle against yellow fever. They were pleased to be told about the memorial window to Dr. Wellford in St. Peter's Episcopal Church. Such things make our library a true, if informal, information center.

In behalf of the library staff, I would like to thank the Library Board, who so willingly give of their time and talents, the City and County Commissioners who provide the financing for the library, and the people throughout Nassau County who make good use of our library services.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT----ADDENDUM MAY 7, 1977

Since writing the above report I have received notice of an additional grant of Federal money in the amount of \$7,107 for use in Nassau County. This money will be used for a film program. The plan, as projected, will allow feature films, of high caliber, to be shown in Fernandina Beach, Callahan, Hilliard and Yulee, every other week through September, 1977.

We anticipate using the auditorium at the Recreation Center for the programs in Fernandina Beach. In Callahan, Hilliard and Yulee, I would like to ask your permission and cooperation to use the County Buildings for these programs. Time for planning is short since we must get the program underway early in June. The grant money must be spent by October 1, 1977. Brochures and posters will be printed and schools and churches alerted to notify as many as possible about this program. Any suggestions that you may have will be most appreciated at this time.
