### AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL ACCOUNTING SERVICES TO NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this <u>26THday of AUGUST</u>, 1991, and effective immediately by and between David M. Griffith and Associates, Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "Consultant") and Nassau County, State of Florida (hereinafter referred to as "County"), WITNESSEIH THAT:

#### **NOW THEREFORE**, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Employment of Consultant.</u> The County agrees to engage the Consultant and the Consultant hereby agrees to perform the following services.
- 2. <u>Scope of Services.</u> The Consultant shall do, perform and carry out in a good and professional manner the services outlined in DMG's letter proposal dated August 21, 1991.
- 3. <u>Time of Performance</u>. The services to be performed hereunder by the Consultant shall be undertaken and completed in such sequence as to assure their expeditious completion and best carry out the purposes of the agreement.
- 4. <u>Compensation</u>. The County agrees to pay the Consultant a sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500) for all services required herein, which shall include reimbursement for expenses incurred. Payment for services will be rendered upon completion of the project and acceptance by the County.
- 5. <u>Changes</u>. The County may, from time to time, require changes in the scope of the services of the Consultant to be performed hereunder. Such changes, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the County and the Consultant, shall be incorporated in written amendment to this agreement and compensated based upon DMG's standard hourly rate.
- 6. Services and Materials to be Furnished by the County. The County shall locally furnish the Consultant with all available necessary information, data, and material pertinent to the execution of this agreement. The County shall cooperate with the Consultant in carrying out the work herein and shall provide adequate staff for <u>liaison</u> with the Consultant and other agencies of County government. In addition, the County shall furnish adequate work space for the Consultant.

- 7. <u>Termination of Agreement for Cause.</u> If, through any cause, the Consultant shall fail to fulfill in timely and proper manner his obligations under this agreement, the County shall thereupon have the right to terminate this agreement by giving written notice to the Consultant of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least five (5) days before the effective date of such termination.
- 8. <u>Information and Reports.</u> The Consultant shall, at such time and in such form as the County may require, furnish such periodic reports concerning the status of the project, such statements, certificates, approvals, and copies of proposed and executed plans and claims and other information relative to the project as may be requested by the County.
- 9. <u>Notices.</u> Any notices, bills, invoices, or reports required by this agreement shall be sufficient if sent by the parties in the United States mail, postage paid, to the addresses noted below:



The information needed will be for the fiscal year ended September 30, 1991 and will include:

- Actual tonnage received at all Nassau County disposal locations for fiscal year ended September 30, 1991;
- Actual operational costs for all disposal locations and transfer sites for fiscal year ended September 30, 1991;
- All contracts with outside contractors;
- All County ordinances or interlocal agreements pertaining to solid waste management services;
- Audited financial statements; and,
- Departmental detailed expenditure reports.

DMG's fee estimate is based on our knowledge of similar organizations, normal availability of appropriate statistics, and our understanding of your requirements. Our fee, therefore, is our hourly estimate multiplied by our standard billing rates of the appropriate staff. Travel/expenses are included in our proposed fee.

DMG proposes to complete the engagement for a not-to-exceed fee of \$3,500. Should the County require any additions to the scope of work, DMG will bill the County based on our standard hourly rate plus expenses.
