RE: Nassau County/NEFRPC Contract dated February 24, 1992 -- "Supplemental Funding Program Contract

As you are aware, the above referenced contract was originally prepared by the NEFRPC in December 1991. Between the time this contract was prepared by the NEFRPC and was signed by the Chairman of your County Commission, the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) had added a work task beyond the original scope of work proposed by the NEFRPC. This additional task was added to page one "Scope of Services" in Nassau County/NEFRPC contract, but was inadvertently omitted from the Scope of Services defined in Attachment A.

To ensure that the County and the NEFRPC is in accord in concept as to the work product due the County under this contract, the NEFRPC proposes that the Nassau County/NEFRPC contract be amended to substitute the Attachment A from Nassau County's contract with the DCA in place of Attachment A of the County's contract with the NEFRPC. This action will bring Attachment A into accord with the Scope of Services defined on page 1 of the Nassau County/NEFRPC contract and will ensure that the NEFRPC is committed to produce the exact product that the County must provide under its contract with DCA.

This proposed contract amendment will not entail a change in the contract fee of \$21,400.
