CONTRACT FOR MANAGING THE NASSAU COUNTY RECYCLING DROP OFF BINS

The Nassau County recycling program efficiency and effectiveness would improve if the program were publicized and the citizenry educated on the need to recycle to meet solid waste reduction goals.

Keep Nassau Beautiful will manage the recycling program by:

- Selecting sites for and monitoring the use of the bins
- Reviewing bin siting and recommending changes for best results
- Publicizing the recycling program
- Conducting public education efforts to support the recycling program
- Collecting data on recycling effectiveness

This proposal covers the period January 1, 1994 through September 30, 1994. In the beginning, recycling would be provided only for newsprint, aluminum cans, glass, and possibly corrugated boxes. Information development and planning would commence January 1, 1994.

Educational materials would include information on where to take all recyclable material in Northeast Florida. There would be an ongoing series of newspaper articles, a brochure, and bill stuffers. Flyers would be distributed/available at the major food stores in the County. Signs would be posted at the sites indicating what can be and how to prepare materials for recycling. The brochure would be mailed to all county residences. An aggressive campaign of public speaking to citizen's groups will be instituted.

Sites should have two to three bins at them. Bins would be reconfigured to hold one material only. Proposed sites would be: South Amelia Island, Hilliard, Callahan, O'Neal, Yulee and Bryceville. Sites should be on public property.

KNB would visit each site as required to check capacities and compliance with the rules for the recycling bins.

A hauler would be contracted to take full bins to recyclers, or to a centralized consolidation site in Nassau County and then take full loads to market, and to maintain bins at each site. The hauler would be responsible for cleaning and minor maintenance to the bins. The hauler's fee would be paid by the county.

Data collection and analysis would be done by KNB and provided to Nassau County on a quarterly basis.

County support would be requested for ordinance development if needed, code enforcement, and bin monitoring at sites where it would be convenient, i.e. manned county property. Code enforcement action is anticipated if bin contaminants are identified to a specific source.


KNB's fee for the service is \$8,000 per quarter which shall be paid in the months of January, April, July. It is understood that this contract is to be reviewed with the new Nassau County Solid Waste Director prior to continuation beyond the first quarter.

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
