# CONTRACT BETWEEN NASSAU COUNTY AND NORTHEAST FLORIDA REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL FOR UPDATING THE NASSAU COUNTY FFF SYSTEM

The following Agreement between Nassau County and the Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council (NEFRPC) entered into 10-24-94, 1994, authorizes the NEFRPC staff to update and prepare impact fee recommendations for each of the following five facility types: transportation, administrative space, fire protection/emergency medical services, police protection, and parks and recreation. The development of the five impacts fees above will be based upon the following general methodology: the compilation and review of current facility inventories; the assessment of future needs and existing deficiencies based upon LOS standards for each facility; and allocation of a proportionate, or fair-share of facility costs to future growth and development. The specific tasks to be performed pursuant to this contract for each of the impact fee categories are set forth below and incorporated as part of this Agreement.

## I. Scope of Services

#### A. <u>Transportation</u>

- 1. Establish Major Road Network
  - a. Determine County road network to constitute the Major Roadway network for which capacity improvements could be funded through the transportation impact fee system.
  - b. Inventory all available counts, including but not limited to, FDOT traffic count data, DRI annual report traffic counts, and special studies traffic counts. Determine those roadway segments on the Nassau County Roadway Network for which counts are necessary.

#### 2. Review and Modify Impact Fee Parameters

- a. Trip rate, average trip length, and diversion factor data will be reviewed and, if determined to be necessary, modified to reflect more current available information in calculating the proportionate demand for all uses to be included in the impact fee schedule.
- b. Adjust LOS standards and service volumes to reflect most current updated FDOT standards for all roadways on the State Highway System, and County standards for those County roadways on the Major Roadway network. This information then is used as input for determining required new lane miles.
- c. Estimate construction and right-of-way costs per mile of improvements scenario developed in the transportation improvement plan pursuant to (d) above. Formulate total

road costs needed to address expected deficiencies on the roadway network as a result of new development.

### 2. Expand Number of Land Use Categories

a. The number of land uses within the Nassau County Transportation Impact Fee is limited. These categories will be expanded using the ITE Trip Generation Manual, 5th Ed., and other available sources in order to provide a more accurate listing of uses for determining the appropriate impact fee.

#### 3. Review and Update Roadway Finance Credits

- a. Modify Nassau County gas tax data and FDOT revenue alloca tion to reflect latest capital improvement funding resources available to determine credit against impact fee to be attributed to developer.
- b. Determine net and present value of gas tax to be paid for a bonding or financing period.

#### 4. Cost Allocation

a. Roadway improvement costs calculated above will be allocated to each of the categories of development according to the proportionate demand calculated above.

## 5. Impact Fee Determination

a. Impact fee will be calculated based on the cost allocation calculated above. Proportionate share impact fees are less than or equal to the net fiscal impact. To determine the net impact cost, a reduction is made for credits based on gas tax calculations. Adjustments to the impact fee and the percentage charged to land uses shall be made at the direction of the County Commission.

# B. Administrative Space

- 1. Inventory Existing Public Building Space and Develop Costs
  - a. Through consultation with Nassau County, review and update inventory of public building square footage used in calculation of original impact fee, use of buildings, and the general location of each.
  - b. Update and calculate total value of public building space as necessary through analysis of cost/square footage ratios used in original analysis.

### 2. Assess Standards for Administrative Space

a. Update functional population and review original methods for

equitably allocating costs through determining the number of persons expected to utilize administrative space per land use activity.

#### 3. Calculate Revenue Credit

a. General taxation credits will be calculated and allocated as appropriate to avoid double charging new development for the costs of providing additional administrative space.

#### 4. Allocate Administrative Space Costs

a. Administrative building costs found under B.1.b will be allocated to each unit of development according to its proportionate demand calculated in B.2.a.

# C. Police Protection

- 1. Calculate Existing Demand and Develop Costs
  - a. Inventory number of vehicles by type, support equipment, stations, substations, and other capital items.
  - b. Analyze cost calculations and update as necessary for the capital facilities inventory.
- 2. Establish Standard for Police Protection
  - a. Review all available County records to develop a standard of calls for service to capital facilities inventory.
- 3. Develop Revenue Credit for Existing Funding
  - a. Analyze existing non-impact fee revenue sources to determine whether the 25 percent reduction used in existing police protection calculation should be modified.
- 4. Develop Cost Allocation for Police Protection and Impact Fee
  - a. Based on any modifications to inventory costs and new stan dard for capital facilities inventory, calculate cost allocation per unit for police protection costs. Apply revenue credit to calculate appropriate impact fee.

# D. Fire Protection/Emergency Medical Services

- 1. Calculate Existing Demand and Develop Costs
  - a. Inventory number of vehicles by type, support equipment, stations, substations, and other capital items.
  - b. Analyze cost calculations and update as necessary for the capital facilities inventory.
- 2. Establish Standard for Fire Protection/EMS
  - a. Review all available County records to develop a standard of calls for service to capital facilities inventory.
- 3. Develop Revenue Credit for Existing Funding
  - a. Analyze existing non-impact fee revenue sources to determine whether the 25 percent reduction used in existing fire protection/EMS calculation should be modified.
- 4. Develop Cost Allocation for Fire Protection/EMS and Impact Fee
  - a. Based on any modifications to inventory costs and new stan dard for capital facilities inventory, calculate cost allocation per unit for fire protection/EMS costs. Apply revenue credit to calculate appropriate impact fee.

#### E. Parks and Recreation

- 1. Determine Existing Inventory and Cost
  - a. Review Recreation and Open Space Element in Comprehensive Plan to determine number of park acres per park type and number and type of recreational facilities. Review LOS standard for parks and recreation adopted in Element or modify if necessary and upon direction from the Nassau County Planning Department to establish level of service for impact fee calculation.
  - b. Determine costs of existing facilities, including land costs and facility costs.
- 2. Determine Standard for Parks and Recreation
  - a. Using standards from the County's Recreation and Open Space Element, determine LOS standards for all recreation components, basing service demand on population. Determine separate standards for parks and park facilities to allow the County to establish impacts fees for facilities, land, or both.

- 3. Determine Applicable Credit
- a. Determine other available revenues in the County which are earmarked for parks and recreation facilities, i.e., Port funds, etc.

# 4. Develop Cost Allocation and Impact Fee

a. Based on the costs of recreational facilities determined above and the unit standard for which parks and recreation facilities are provided, determine costs per unit. Apply credit to the cost in determining the appropriate impact fee.

### F. Meetings

a. The NEFRPC staff will attend up to three public meetings to present the findings of the study and the recommendations for any modified fee schedule/new impact fees. Additionally, a maximum of one meeting per fee type be conducted as necessary with County staff to exchange data, discuss recommendations, and provide preliminary results.

# II. Schedule of Deliverables

All work leading to the completion of the impact fee study will be completed on or before May 1, 1995. The Transportation Impact Fee Study will be completed on or before February 15, 1995. Public meetings will be conducted following submittal of the draft study to Nassau County staff at regularly scheduled County hearings. A progress report on the Transportation Impact Fee will be provided on December 15, 1994; with a progress report submitted for the other elements on February 1, 1995, with results of work in progress for review by Nassau County.

## III. Changes or Additions to the Scope of Services

#### A. Changes

Either party may request changes in the Score of Services to be performed. Such changes as are mutually agreed upon, or are necessitated by changes in applicable law, shall be incorporated as written amendments to this Agreement. Any additional compensation shall be agreed upon by both parties.

#### B. Additional Services

If authorized in writing by Nassau County, the NEFRPC shall furnish additional services which are not provided for in the Scope of Services set forth above, or which are not considered normal of customary basic services; such services are to be paid for as agreed upon by both parties.

# IV. Specific Council Responsibilities

- A. Provide the County with updates on progress as requested.
- B. Provide the County with a completed Transportation impact fee study (Task A above) on or before February 15, 1995. Provide the County with the completed impact fee study for the other components (Tasks B through E above in Scope of Services) on or before May 1, 1995.
- C. Attend all public hearings as specified in this Agreement to present findings and recommendations contained in the Impact Fee Study.

### V. Specific Nassau County Responsibilities

- A. Make available all pertinent County data, resources, and other necessary information to NEFRPC staff as required to complete the tasks specified in the Scope of Services above.
- B. Designate a person to act as the Nassau County representative with respect to the services to be rendered under this contract. Such person will have authority to transmit instructions, receive information, and interpret and define Nassau County's policies relative to this agreement.
- C. Provide adequate notification of the time and location of all meetings that NEFRPC staff is requested to attend.

C. All written or verbal communications transmitting instructions or receiving information regarding the execution of this contract shall be between or at the request of these contact persons.

### VII. Project Costs

The estimated project costs for completing the above Scope of Services is provided as specified herein. The total project costs for each component of the impact fee study shall not exceed the following amounts under this Agreement:

A. 1	Traffic Volume Data Collection	\$10,000
В.	Administrative Space	\$ 7,000
С.	Police Protection	\$ 6,000
D.	Fire Protection/Emergency Medical Services	\$ 6,600
Ε.	Parks and Recreation	\$ 4,800

The total specified above does not include a legal review fee of \$12,000. The legal review fee will paid by Nassau County for the service of an attorney to be selected upon mutual agreement between the two parties of this agreement for review of the final draft of the recommendation.

# VIII. Schedule of Payments

The contract fee of \$57,400 for work completed under this Agreement shall be remitted as follows:

- a. \$10,000 for traffic data collection due November 30, 1994
- a. \$11,300 due January 1, 1995
- b. \$11,300 due February 15, 1995
- c. \$11,400 due March 15, 1995
- d. \$11,400 due April 30, 1995
- e. \$ 2,000 due following last meeting under this Agreement.

#### IX. Records

The NEFRPC shall maintain all books, documents, paper, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred in the work and shall make such materials available at all reasonable times during the period of the Agreement for three (3) years from the date of final payment under the Agreement for inspection and/or audit by the County or other pertinent public agencies.

#### X. Termination of Agreement

- A. In the event of a termination of this Agreement without cause by Nassau County, the County shall be responsible to cover the cost of the NEFRPC up to twenty percent of the cost incurred as of the date of said termination. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon 30 days written notice should the other party fail substantially to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement through no fault of others.
- B. Without waiving its right to terminate this Agreement, Nassau County may delay, withhold or adjust payments under this Agreement, or the NEFRPC may delay or withhold its services in an attempt to give each party an opportunity to fulfill its obligations or correct any violation of this contract. The NEFRPC reserves the right to complete such analyses and records as are necessary to place their files in order, and where considered by them as necessary to protect their professional reputation, to complete a report on the services performed to date.
- C. In the event of termination, copies of all finished or unfinished documents, data, correspondence, reports, and maps prepared by the NEFRPC staff under this Agreement shall be delivered to Nassau County.

#### XI. Controlling Law

This agreement is to be governed by the laws of the State of Florida.

#### XII. Successors and Assigns

- A. NEFRPC and Nassau County each binds itself and its partners, successors, executors, administrators, assigns and legal representatives of such other party, in respect to all covenants and obligation of this Agreement.
- B. Nothing herein shall be construed to give any rights or benefits hereunder to anyone other than NEFRPC and Nassau County.

#### AMENDMENT #1

# CONTRACT BETWEEN NASSAU COUNTY AND THE

# NORTHEAST FLORIDA REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL TO EXTEND THE CURRENT CONTRACT FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE NASSAU COUNTY SHIP PROGRAM

The agreement described herein has been prepared in accordance with Section II <u>Changes or Additions to the Scope of Services</u> presented in the original contract signed by both parties on April 12th and 16th 1992. The purpose of Amendment #1 is to extend the period of performance of the originally executed contract through Fiscal Years 1994-95 and 1995-96.

In addition, Amendment #1 shall provide for the Northeast FLorida Regional Planning Council to administer two (2) new programs acquired by Nassau County (the FloridaFix and U.S. HUD Section 8 Rental Certificate Program); both programs having been brought into the County through efforts of the Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council.

#### I. Scope of Services

#### SHIP Program

The Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council shall provide materials, travel costs and 650 man-hours of effort per Fiscal Year in fulfilling program requirements as defined in Rule 9I-37 FAC for administration of the SHIP Program. Administrative tasks include seeking and qualifying program participants, maintaining program records and preparing all reports required by the above noted Rule. In addition, the NEFRPC staff shall commit up to 390 man-hours per Fiscal Year to fulfill responsibilities associated with non-administrative efforts which include site surveys to determine eligible emergency repairs or rehabilitative work, coordination with contractors to perform (and subsequently inspect) required work and coordination with lending institutions to prepare mortgage packages.

#### FloridaFix Program

The Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council shall provide materials, travel costs and 270 man-hours of effort per Fiscal Years 1994-95 and 1995-96 in fulfilling program requirements as defined in Rule 9B-55 F.A.C. and Nassau County FloridaFix Contract #95FF-67-02-47-18-026 with the Department of Community Affairs. All FloridaFix emergency repair and weatherization work shall be conducted as an extension of work completed under the Nassau County SHIP Program.

#### U.S. HUD Section 8 Rental Certificate Program

The Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council shall provide Materials, travel costs and 390 man-hours of effort per Fiscal Years 1994-95 and 1995-96 in fulfilling the administrative requirements of the Nassau County/U.S. HUD Section 8 Rental Certificate Program, Project Number FL29-E148-001, Annual Contributions Contract (ACC).

#### II. Period of Performance

Work performed under Amendment #1 shall commence August 1, 1994 and continue through October 1, 1996.

#### III. Schedule of Payments

Payment for services performed by NEFRPC staff on the three (3) above listed "Affordable Housing" Programs shall be made by the County to the NEFRPC in accordance with the Schedule shown in "Attachment A" and as permitted by U.S. HUD and the Florida Department of Community Affairs under Nassau County contracts with these agencies.

#### IV. Additional Conditions

Upon executing Amendment #1 by both parties, all other conditions of the orignal Nassau County/NEFRPC contract remain in effect.

# CONTRACT BETWEEN NASSAU COUNTY AND THE NORTHEAST FLORIDA REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL FOR PLANNING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FUNCTIONS

The following Agreement between Nassau County and the Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council (NEFRPC) authorizes the NEFRPC staff to provide technical assistance to Nassau County for various planning functions which may be requested by the County.

The Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council will perform assorted planning functions for Nassau County as may be requested in writing by the County. These planning functions may include but are not limited to; review of zoning applications and site plans, the preparation and/or review of comprehensive plan amendments, the review of proposed projects for concurrency purposes; and any other special planning functions that the County may request.

Ms. Lessie Mosher of the County Planning Department has been designated the County as the primary contact for this Agreement. All requests for planning assistance through this agreement shall be in written form from Ms. Mosher or the Nassau County Attorney. The written notice will, at a minimum, include the work task to be completed, any time requirements or deadlines for the tasks, and the contact person at the County if different from Ms. Mosher.

Nassau County will make available to the NEFRPC all pertinent data, resources, or other necessary background information that they may possess which may be needed for the NEFRPC to complete the planning technical assistance work tasks requested.

# Schedule of Payments

Nassau County will reimburse the NEFRPC monthly for all work undertaken to complete or partially complete requested work task at a rate of \$44.00 per hour. The NEFRPC will invoice the County monthly for all work tasks undertaken during that month. Each invoice will include an itemized breakdown of and the number of hours to complete each task undertaken since the last invoice. Nassau County will timely reimburse the NEFRPC upon receipt of each invoice.

#### Records

The NEFRPC shall maintain all books, documents, paper, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred in the work and shall make such materials available at all reasonable times during the period of this agreement, and for a period of three (3) years from the date of the final payment under the agreement for inspection and/or audit by the County.

This agreement is to be governed by the laws of the State of Florida.
