SUBJECT: Modification to Emergency Management Preparedness and Assistance (EMPA)
Base Grant Agreement

As explained in Joe Myers' March 1 memo to each of you, the enclosed modification to your current year EMPA Base Grant Agreement is provided pursuant to Rule Chapter 9G-19.007(6), Florida Administrative Code, which awards to county emergency management agencies reallocation of any funds remaining after the awarding of competitive funds to municipal emergency management programs.

For those counties that requested a carry forward of a portion of last year's award, a second item addressing that increase is also included in this modification. Both increases to your award are subject to the same guidelines, procedures and restrictions covering your original award amount.

Please have all four copies of the enclosed modification signed by the appropriate official as soon as possible and return them to Dee Giles, Finance and Logistics Management, Division of Emergency Management. A fully executed copy will be returned for your records; please make the modification a part of your Agreement file.

SUBJECT: Modification to FY 1995-96 County Emergency Management Preparedness
and Assistance (EMPA) Program Agreement

As most of you are aware, Rule Chapter 9G-19.006, F.A.C. provides for the redistribution of any funds remaining after the initial distribution of EMPA base grants for counties. Because all 67 counties are now maintaining full-time EMPA programs, the entire amount appropriated for county distribution this year was allocated initially, leaving no balance to redistribute in the manner prescribed by Rule.

There is a second rule section, Chapter 9G-19.007 (6), F.A.C., which also provides for a redistribution of funds to county emergency management agencies. This second redistribution is associated with any balance remaining after the awarding of EMPA municipal competitive grants. Amounts are calculated using the same method as the reallocation of the base grant balance.

After a five-month delay due to score appeals, the final awards have now been made in the competitive grant program and the remaining balance officially determined. The attached report indicates the calculated amounts which will be available to each county as a result of the redistribution of a \$322 thousand balance. These funds will be made available to you through a modification to your existing EMPA agreement and will be subject to the same provisions detailed in that contractual agreement.

In the interest of minimizing processing time and paperwork, we are also utilizing the same modification document to include the amounts requested and approved for carry forward from FY 1994-95's county base grant award into the current year for expenditure. The attached report shows these amounts, also.

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The last column on the report indicates the total amount by which your existing contract will be increased. We are currently developing these individual contract modifications and will be providing you with this additional expenditure authority within the next few weeks. [NOTE: for the two counties that have not executed their original agreement, be advised that the modification cannot be executed until the original is executed.]

MODIFICATION TO AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, **NASSAU** County (hereinafter "the County") and the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Emergency Management (hereinafter "the Department") have entered into a grant agreement for fiscal year 1995-1996 for the purpose of improving and enhancing emergency management activities; and

WHEREAS, Rule 9G-19.007(6), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), provides for the distribution of additional funds from the Emergency Management Preparedness and Assistance Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, based upon these facts, the parties desire to modify said agreement to provide additional funds to the County;


NOW, THEREFORE, the above-referenced agreement is modified as follows:

Attachment F FUNDING/MATCHING, paragraph A., is modified to reflect \$70,079 as the total amount of funds available under this agreement. This amount includes the initial 1995-96 base allocation and the reallocation of funds pursuant to Rule Chapter 9G-19.007(6), F.A.C.

All other terms and conditions of the agreement shall remain in full force and effect.


