

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 20 day of February, 2003, by and between the County of Nassau, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and the Episcopal Children's Services, Inc., hereinafter referred to as AGENCY.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the citizens of Nassau County that the EPISCOPAL CHILDREN'S SERVICES program continue, and

WHEREAS, the AGENCY provides quality child care to Nassau County's low income children and parents.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. For and in consideration of the sum of \$12,058.00, which shall be paid in quarterly installments, during the months of November, February, May and August, the AGENCY does hereby agree to perform services that will benefit the residents of Nassau County. Said services to include but not be limited to the following:
 - a. Continuing the present level of services provided for the economically deprived children and parents of Nassau County, Florida.
2. The AGENCY shall make their financial records available to the COUNTY for purposes of an audit, if requested by the COUNTY. The COUNTY shall require an audit of previous year's financial records to be performed by an independent accounting firm. The audit report must be presented to the COUNTY before the May distribution will be made.
3. All facilities, programs and services should be compliant with the Florida Accessibility Code and the federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Failure to provide facilities, programs, or services that are compliant with both the Florida Accessibility Code and the federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) shall be considered a breach of the contract.



12:22 It was moved by Commissioner Acree, seconded by Commissioner Marshall and unanimously carried to continue to March 12, 2003 discussion of sidewalks in Arnold Ridge.

12:23 Mr. Mullin provided an update on the Florida Water situation and upon his recommendation it was moved by Commissioner Marshall, seconded by Commissioner Acree and unanimously carried to schedule a public hearing for February 18, 2003 at 6:00 p.m. regarding the acquisition of Florida Water Services and or Florida Water Services Authority in the unincorporated areas of Amelia Island.

12:24 The County Attorney read a proposed resolution honoring those citizens serving in the Armed Forces. It was moved by Commissioner Marshall, seconded by Commissioner Vanzant and unanimously carried to adopt Resolution 2003-31 honoring our citizens who are serving in the Armed Forces, and who are or will be in the Middle East and may be involved in armed conflict should our President determine that force is necessary.

12:27 As discussed at a previous meeting, the group reviewed a request for funding from the Episcopal Children Services. It was moved by Commissioner Deonas, seconded by Commissioner Vanzant and unanimously carried to provide funding in the amount of \$12,058 to the Episcopal Children Services for fiscal year 2002/03.
