
Amendment 1 to Agreement

This Amendment entered into on Would 5, 2004, serves to amend portions of the Agreement dated March 31, 2003, by and between the Department of Environmental Protection, hereinafter referred to as Department, and Nassau County, hereinafter referred to as Grantee, for the approved recreational project known as North End Nature Center and Marine Park, Project # 12-00428, pursuant to section 375.021, Florida Statutes and Part VII, chapter 62D-5, Florida Administrative Code.

In and for the mutual covenants between them, the Department and the Grantee agree that the following amendment shall apply to the above referenced Agreement:

Paragraph 3, is amended as follows: The Grantee shall construct, or cause to be constructed, specified public outdoor recreation facilities and improvements consisting of the following Project Elements which may be modified by the Department if Grantee shows good cause: fishing piers, picnic facilities, restroom and other related support facilities.

In all other respects the Agreement of which this is an Amendment and attachments relative thereto shall remain in full force and effect.

Mike,

On October 10, 2003 at 1:00 p.m. Dawn Stevenson, Daniel Salmon, Tim Milligan and I met to discuss the items, steps needed to closeout the current contract on Dee Dee Bartels (with Hal Jones) and to strategically position ourselves, Nassau County, to complete Part 2 of the process necessary to closeout the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) grant. The purpose of this email is to give you an overview of what was discussed during the meeting, coupled with narrative on how we collectively would like to proceed in completing this necessary project.

Part 1 of this project is that part which coincides with the Florida Boating Improvement Program (FBIP) grant funding of \$500,000 through the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FFWC).

- Part 1 is under contract with Hal Jones.
- Current issues regarding accessibility are: 1. Gangway; 2. Guard rail; 3. Hand rail; 4. Detectable warning.
- Remaining items include: 5. Site lighting parking and pier, navigational lights; 6. Distribution panel electrical (Transformer pad FPU pulling wire to pad); 7. Signage temporary no wake signs; temporary site sign; Hal Jones site specific signage.

Execution of the above listed items will deem the proper level for closeout of Part 1. No issues are anticipated to meet this requirement.

On a side note, Dawn and I spoke on Friday, October 24, 2003 and the corrected shop drawing were due in on Friday and the contractor committed to have the work complete within 15 days (after approved shop drawings). I misunderstood the original discussion and thought the work would be complete 7-10 days after the cost estimate/work program to remedy the accessibility issues was authorized (which was October 13, 2003). In any case, the completion date for correcting these items should coincide with, based on my thoughts, or touch November 7th which puts us just three (3) weeks shy of the official closeout date for this grant funding, November 30, 2003.

- I spoke with Wendy Huszagh of Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission on October 16, 2003
 regarding the Florida Boating Improvement Program grant and closeout. Three significant things were
 presented in that regard.
 - **First**, Wendy explained that even though the pavilion/shelter was included in FBIP grant application, that FFWC does not fund those items and as such the shelter/shelter would not be an eligible expense with FBIP funds. This is the key reason that this item would be funded under the Land and Water Conservation Fund grant. Also, when the grant agreement was signed on August 8, 2002 by FFWC and FFWC included the letter from Mr. Gossett dated April 26, 2002 as part of their contract.
 - **Second**, Customarily a site visit is conducted by the funding agency prior to completing the closeout documents. Per Wendy it was her understanding that Dr. Madkour, her boss, did a site visit for Dee Dee Bartels 2-3 weeks prior to my discussion with Wendy on October 16th and everything passed the site visit. When I followed up with Dawn after this conversation, she also recalled Dr. Madkour doing a site visit but it was with the contractor since Dawn was out at that time.
 - Third, with the work complete and the site visit in the affirmative, then the Certificate of Completion form is the only remaining item. Per Wendy, when sending for reimbursement, submit the invoice(s) with letter stipulating "funding for this project has been used for (specify whatever was spent)" and as a running thought document in the letter that funding for the restroom will come from the LWCF grant signifying title of grant, and anticipated completion date; this is to simply show that this item will be done and that Nassau County will proceed in that direction.

Part 2 of this project is that part which coincided with the Land and Water Conservation Fund grant project through the Department of Environmental Protection. This is a 50/50 matching grant. The grant request was made for the maximum of \$200,000 and based upon the grant application the local fund commitment was \$261,500.

- Part 2 is in its initial stages. A complete set of Design Drawings by Ebert, Norman and Brady Architects was issued on September 29, 2003.
- The items that would apply under this grant application include: water, wastewater, pavilion, restroom, and walking

trails. Considering each item individually the following is the summary applies.

- 1. Water. For the line extension based upon Dawn Stevenson's letter dated September 15, 2003, this cost is estimated at \$143,928. For one well, the cost based on the October 10, 2003 meeting identified above is (a) \$20-25 thousand without engineering cost or (b) \$30 thousand with engineering cost.
- 2. Wastewater. \$5,100 has been paid for the design and engineering cost for the septic tank drain field along with the 2 inch water line. I have in my notes from the meeting, \$20,000 for the construction; Dawn, Daniel please confirm whether I got this information correct.
- 3. Pavilion and Restroom. Although these items are separate they need to be considered together since they share the same building footprint but different roofs.
 - **Position 1:** As it stands the design approved by the Nassau County BOCC can be built by a contractor for \$300,000.
 - **Position 2:** Consideration can be given for an in-house job using the Parks and Recreation & Building Maintenance Departments as contractor. This entails these departments working from the professional cost estimator's information (which to be best of my understanding the professional estimator's is currently underway through the architects.) The intent of Position 2 is to significantly reduce the cost of this project, estimated at \$300,000, by at least 25%. The work for Position 2 could begin within 6 months. A key feature for consideration in looking at the original grant application and consulting with staff at the October 10th meeting is that the original thought was for the Parks and Recreation Department to build the pavilion and restroom.
- 4. Walking trails. The walking trails component of this grant application is subject to removal per the June 5, 2003 letter from Collier Clark at Department of Environment Protection and is contingent upon approval from the National Parks Service on the deleting the trails.
- Another significant note from the June 5, 2003 letter from Collier Clark at Department of Environment Protection is
 that Nassau County was given authorization to commence project construction. This means that some of the
 funds expended to date, but after June 5, 2003 can be charged out to Part 2 of this project. The letter also
 reflects the 90 day status report requirement with the first one due July 5, 2003 and the project completion date of
 March 31, 2006.

Thus concludes this discourse on Dee Dee Bartels Nature Center and Fishing Pier.

Eron - You were correct in saying that the cost was \$5115.00 (per their proposal totaling \$23,373.00 approved 6-3-03). In their invoicing they have the total amount broken out into three tasks - 1. Facility Design (plumbing, septic, waterline) \$9715.00 - 2. Electircal Design \$3,000.00 - 3. Architectural Design \$10,658.00. To date only 10% (\$971.50) has been payed for Task 1 which leaves an amount of \$8,743.50 to complete the design of the septic system and plumbing.

Dear Mr. Clark,

In response to our phone conversation last week please find attached the LWCF Commencement Documents Packet for the above referenced project. As previously explained, Nassau County has already commenced construction on this project. It was not until I received a copy of the grant agreement and began reviewing it that I realized this commencement package was required. Please accept my apology on behalf of Nassau County for this oversight.

In addition to the above, the possibility of Nassau County obtaining a waiver for the construction of "walking trails" was discussed. Article 3. of the grant agreement requires the construction of Project Elements consisting of walking trails, fishing piers, picnic facilities, restroom and other related support facilities. Article 3. also states that the Project Elements may be modified by the Department if the Grantee shows good cause. Due to the configuration of the site plan improvements, the walking trails would have to be constructed adjacent to the entrance roadway. The placement of the trails along the roadway would be a safety hazard, would be nearly impossible to maintain ADA accessibility and would not be aesthetically pleasing.

Please accept this letter as a formal request for an amendment to the above referenced grant agreement. Attached is a copy of the site plan for your review during your consideration of the amendment. If any additional documents or justification or needed for the potential amendment please let me know as soon as possible.

INTRODUCTION

The Land and Water Conservation Fund Program (LWCF) provides grants to local governmental entities to acquire or develop land for public outdoor recreational purposes. The program is administered by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Bureau of Design and Recreation Services on behalf of the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service (NPS). Grant applications are evaluated according to policies and procedures described in Chapter 62D-5, Part VII, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). This is commonly known as the LWCF Rule. All applicants should be familiar with these policies and procedures. This packet is designed to assist all applicants in presenting the necessary information needed for DEP to evaluate proposed grant applications.

GENERAL APPLICATION INFORMATION

Please submit the application in a SOFT COVER 3 prong blnder (please, no HARD 3-ring binders). To facilitate the review and scoring process, tab all support documents or attachments according to Part III of this application. We appreciate your cooperation.

A request for financial assistance must be for acquisition or development of land for public outdoor recreational purposes. An acquisition project approved for funding must be acquired within one (1) year of the effective date of the project agreement and must be developed for public use within three (3) years of completion of acquisition. An approved acquisition project, will require a self contained narrative appraisal(s), title search, and, if applicable, a mean or ordinary high water survey prior to project commencement. The appraisal(s) will be reviewed by a fee appraiser under contract with DEP's Division of State Lands. Payment of appraisal review fees will be the responsibility of the grantee and will be made by the grantee immediately upon and pursuant to direction of the Bureau of Design and Recreation Services. These expenses are not eligible for relimbursement under the LWCF program.

A development proposal should consist of the complete or partial development of the project site. The grantee shall have up to three (3) years from the effective date of the project agreement to complete the project. A development project, when completed, must be a useable recreation area. A development application may consist of one improvement or a group of related improvements designed to provide primary facilities for outdoor recreation. Secondary or support facilities and improvements for access, safety and protection of the project visitors are viable project components but should not dominate the proposed project. Primary facility costs must be equal to or greater than fifty percent of the total project cost. 
