# RE: COST PROPOSAL FOR ODOR CONTROL PLAN AND IMPLEMENTATION WEST NASSAU LANDFILL NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA

Dear Mr. Mahaney:

Golder Associates Inc. (Golder) is pleased to submit this cost proposal to the Nassau County Board of County Commissioners (Board) to provide professional services to prepare an Odor Control Plan as requested by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) in its letter dated December 9, 2005. The following provides a description of the proposed scope of services, schedule, estimated costs, and terms and conditions. Additionally, Golder has obtained a preliminary cost estimate to implement one of the potential options for odor control (to be determined in the Odor Control Plan). This option is the high-pressure odor control system that sprays a chemical into the air that masks the landfill odor, which we have costed out under Task 2000.

# **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

#### Task 1000 – Preparation of Odor Control Plan

The scope of services for this task includes the preparation of an Odor Control Plan in accordance with Florida Administrative Code Rule 62-701.530(3)(b)2. This rule requires that the plan shall describe the nature and extent of the problem and the proposed remedy. Golder will prepare the plan and either provide a draft to County staff or discuss the various options with County staff and incorporate any comments prior to submittal to FDEP. This task also includes addressing one round of requests for additional information (RAIs), with the assumption that addressing the RAIs will not require any additional field work or a significant change in the plan.

#### Task 2000 – Implementation of Odor Control Plan

The Odor Control Plan is required to set out a remedy for controlling odors at the site. One option for controlling odors that will be considered by Golder is spraying fragrant chemicals into the air to mask the odors in the area where the odors are of concern. Golder has obtained some preliminary information about these systems and associated costs. A brief review of the site and the area of concern indicates that a high-pressure (1,000 psi) odor control system with

approximately 1,200 linear feet of hoses and nozzles, and automatic controls and timers, would be installed. Installation would be performed by the vendor, assuming the County could have fence posts or similar apparatus in place for mounting the system. The system then would require the use of the chemicals for the system. It is also assumed that Golder would provide limited oversight during installation and set-up. Golder could contract with the vendor, but it may be more beneficial if the County contracted directly with the vendor for warranty purposes and to avoid mark-ups.

It should be noted that Golder will evaluate the use of other options for odor control and select, with input from County staff, the most economical system that will control the odors detected south of the landfill. Therefore, the above system may or may not be the option that will be recommended to be installed at the site and the scope and costs for this task are not certain. However, because of the limited time frame to implement the plan after approval by FDEP (30 days), we felt it was important to provide an option and the potential costs (see below) to the Board for consideration.

# **SCHEDULE**

As indicated in FDEP's letter, the plan is to be submitted for FDEP review by December 27, 2005. To meet this schedule, Golder would need Board approval at its December 14, 2005 meeting. Additionally, any input from County staff would need to be timely for us to meet this schedule. There is a possibility that Golder could request an extension to this schedule, but because of the sensitivity of this issue, it is doubtful that more than about 10 days would be granted. It should be noted that once the plan is approved by FDEP, the County is required to implement the plan within 30 days of that approval.

### COST ESTIMATE

The costs for the services as outlined in this proposal are presented below. The cost for Task 1000 includes approximately 24 hours for a senior engineer, 4 hours for an administrative assistant, and 4 hours for a senior project manager for plan review and project management, plus expenses. The cost for Task 2000 is for the above described odor control system (~\$20,000), vendor installation costs (~4,000), chemical costs (~\$10,000 for a 6-month supply), Golder oversight, and contractor mark-up (which would be eliminated if County contracted directly).





# RE: ODOR MONITOIRNG SUMMARY WEST NASSAU LANDFILL NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA



Dear Mr. Durden:

An odor monitoring program was conducted at the West Nassau Landfill by Golder Associates Inc. (Golder) on behalf of Nassau County in response to an inspection by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) on October 19, 2005. After discussions with FDEP, a program was developed that included the monitoring of odors adjacent to the south side of the landfill property at various times of the day for several days. Monitoring was conducted by "sniffing" the air at locations that were away from the main road south of the landfill (Musselwhite Road) and away from vehicles and other activities that may have influenced the air in the area. For consistency, the same individual, Mr. Jeremy Anderson of Golder, conducted the monitoring on each occasion.

The attached Table 1 summarizes the findings of the odor monitoring program, including the dates and times that the monitoring was conducted. As shown, monitoring was conducted on a total of 17 occasions and there were odors detected on four occasions. These four monitoring events were conducted in the early morning hours. There were never any odors detected other than those four mornings, including mid-morning, mid-afternoon, dusk, and just after dark. The odors that were noted were described as smelling like a leachate-type or landfill gas-type odor, based on the experience of Mr. Anderson.

Golder believes that the monitoring program conducted on the south side of the landfill provided monitoring that was representative of a wide range of times and over a period sufficient to meet the regulatory requirements for an odor monitoring program. Although there were a few odor detections, the majority of the monitoring results indicate no odors south of the landfill. Please review the attached findings and notify the County and Golder if any additional information or data collection is required.


