Problem Identification

The Drug Eradication and Enforcement Task Force (DEET) has consistently observed increases in criminal and narcotic activity in Nassau County since it's inception. This activity includes manufacture/cultivation, sale and use, importation and transportation of illicit narcotics through and into Nassau County.

The County is surrounded by deep water on the North and West side, the Atlantic Ocean on the East side, and the greater Jacksonville metropolitan area (Duval County) on the South. I-95 and US Highway 1 run north and south through the entire county. Nassau County experiences an influx of temporary, tourist and transient population due to its location between the Greater Jacksonville Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) and Kings Bay Naval Submarine Station.

The illegal drug activity adversely affects the entire population of Nassau County at all levels. Nassau County has approximately 70,000 permanent residents and a transient and tourist population of over 350,000 each year. The drug industry thrives on the permanent as well as the temporary residents of this county. The tourist population tends to migrate to the eastern half of the county, which is urban and beachfront. The western half of the county is more rural and experiences the manufacture of methamphetamine and cultivation of marijuana. However, the portability and ease of manufacture of methamphetamine has made the progression to the east side of the county noteworthy. This problem effects the entire population of Nassau County. Whether it is through criminal activity such as burlary, robbery or theft, as well as child abuse and neglect, these crime statistics are directly related to narcotics abuse and are on the rise.

Project Summary

The Nassau County Drug Eradication and Enforcement Task (DEET) force maintains a Criminal Patrol Unit, Narcotics Unit, Marijuana Eradication Unit, K-9 Unit, and a Marine Unit to combat the illegal criminal and narcotic activity. DEET consists of a member of the State Attorneys Office, a Captain, a Sergeant, and five detectives.

The Narcotics Unit serves drug-related search warrants and gathers intelligence and documentation related to domestic and international terrorist, terrorist activity and the financing or futherance of terrorism. A covert facility is in use to enhance these undercover operations. DEET continues to conduct undercover and cover operations. The purchase of specialized covert surveillance and recording equipment helps to further undercover investigations as well as support court testimony and prosecurtion efforts.

The Criminal Patrol Unit is tasked with interception of illicit narcotics and money laundering, terrorist, weapon and explosive related criminal ativity, transportation and use of weapons of mass destruction in correlation with interstate travel, specificially I-95 and US Hwy 1. The Marijuana Eradication Unit actively pursues marijuana cultivation

cases and multi-tasks by utilizing aerial flights in a dual role to eradicate outdoor grows of omestic marijuana as well as reconnaissance for domestic security for the ports and secures channels and bridges by conducting searches of vessels, cargo holds and compartments for transport of illicit narcotics and other contraband.

DEET members have a Mutual Aid Agreement to coordinate with outside agencies such as the Drug Enforcement Agency, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, the Florida Wildlife Commission, and the Florida Air National Guard to request assistance and cooperation. This combine multi-jurisdictional effort exponentially increases the effectiveness of DEET in the interception of illicit narcotics, weapons, and other items that enhance the abilities of suppliers of narcotics to dealers or terrorists and their subsequent apprehension.

Recurring modernization of recording and surveillance equipment is imperative due to changing trens in sale/delivery methods as well as legislation, also due to counterintelligence of narcotics suppliers at all levels.

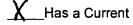
