

AMENDMENT NUMBER 3 / THIRD EXTENSION TO THE AGREEMENT FOR MISDEMEANOR PROBATION SERVICES FOR THE FOURTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT, IN AND FOR NASSAU COUNTY, FL.

THIS Extension Agreement, entered into this 28th day of October, 2013 by and between the **BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, on behalf of the Chief Judge, Fourth Judicial Circuit, hereinafter referred to as "County" and the **SALVATION ARMY**, a Georgia corporation¹ authorized to do business in the State of Florida as a foreign non profit corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor" (collectively, the "parties").

WHEREAS, the parties entered into on December 1, 2008 a Contract for Misdemeanor Probation Services for the Fourth Judicial Circuit, in and for Nassau County, FL ("Contract") which would extend in one (1) year increments upon mutual agreement between the parties; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into on November 10, 2010 an amendment to said Contract to allow for automatic extensions in one month increments; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend said Contract again to allow for extension of the performance period for one (1) year increments by mutual agreement between the parties, provided the County and Court approve any change or transfer of the local probation officer hired for this Contract; and


WHEREAS, the parties agreed to extend the agreement for the period beginning January 1, 2013 and ending December 31, 2013; and

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The performance period is hereby extended for an additional one (1) year beginning January 1, 2014 and ending December 31, 2014.
2. All other provisions of said Contract not in conflict with this Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.




