

# AMENDMENT NO. 02 TO THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR OCEAN RESCUE SERVICES

THIS AMENDMENT entered into this <a href="mailto:sth">8th</a> day of <a href="mailto:june">June</a>, 2020 by and between the BOARD OF COUNTY <a href="mailto:commissioners">COUNTY, FLORIDA, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, (hereinafter referred to as "County") and City of Fernandina Beach, Florida, a political subdivision of the State Of Florida, (hereinafter referred to as "City").

WHEREAS, the parties entered into an Agreement dated February 9, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provided for an initial term of four (4) years beginning October 1, 2010 and ending September 30, 2014, which shall be automatically renewed on an annual basis unless terminated in accordance with section 9 (Termination) of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into subsequent renewal periods for the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement was amended and increased by \$5,000 for personnel costs November 27, 2017 in accordance to section 6 (e); and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Agreement for a second increase in personnel costs in the amount of

\$17,000.00 beginning October 1, 2020 arising from demand placed on these services due to warmer temperatures and the need for a longer season; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to also amend season services detailed in section 5 (c) the Agreement to begin the first weekend in March replacing the original season start date of the first weekend in May.

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. In accordance to section 6 (e) of the Agreement dated February 9, 2011 notification will be provided by November 30<sup>th</sup> of each year of any price increase in the costs associated with provided services. With a request to increase personnel costs to \$125,000.00 beginning October 1, 2020 provided in a letter dated November 26, 2019 included as Attachment "A".
- In accordance with Section 3 of the Agreement, the Agreement will automatically renew on October 1, 2020.
- 3. The season services detailed in Section 5 (c) will now begin the first weekend in March and will

continue through Labor Day replacing the original season start date of the first weekend in May.

4. All other provisions of said agreement not in conflict with this Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.

# AMENDMENT NO. 01 TO THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR OCEAN RESCUE SERVICES

THIS ADDENDUM entered into this 27th day of November , 2017 by and between the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, (hereinafter referred to as "County") and City of Fernandina Beach, Florida, a political subdivision of the State Of Florida, (hereinafter referred to as "City").

WHEREAS, the parties entered into an Agreement dated February 9, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the original agreement provided for an initial term of four (4) years beginning October 1, 2010 and ending September 30, 2014, with an option to automatically renew on an annual basis.

WHEREAS, the parties entered into subsequent renewal periods for the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend and extend said Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

#### Contract Tracking No. CM1721-A1

- In accordance with Section 3 of the Agreement for Ocean Rescue Services dated February 9, 2011, the performance period is hereby extended for an additional one (1) year beginning October 1, 2017 and ending September 30, 2018.
- 2. In accordance to section 6 (e) the agreement dated February 9, 2011 notification will be provided by November 30<sup>th</sup> of each year of any price increase in the costs associated with provided services. A Price increase of \$5,000.00 was given in writing on April 7, 2017 and followed with letter dated September 26, 2017 attached as Exhibit A.
- 3. All other provisions of said agreement not in conflict with this Addendum shall remain in full force and effect.

#### RESOLUTION 2017-163

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FERNANDINA BEACH, FLORIDA, APPROVING AMENDMENT NO. 01 TO THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE NASSAU COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR OCEAN RESCUE SERVICES ON PUBLIC BEACHES; AUTHORIZING EXECUTION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Nassau County has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens and visitors of Nassau County that Ocean Rescue (Lifeguard) Services be provided by the City of Fernandina Beach for the following Nassau County public beaches: Peter's Point Park, Scott Road Beach Access, and Burney Park; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into an agreement dated February 9, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the original agreement provided for an initial term of four years beginning October 1, 2010, and ending September 30, 2014, with an option to automatically renew on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into subsequent renewal periods for the period of October 1, 2014, through September 30, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to increase the amount by \$5,000 and extend said agreement for an additional year, expiring September 30, 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FERNANDINA BEACH, FLORIDA, THAT:

SECTION 1. The City Commission hereby approves Amendment No. 1 to the Interlocal Agreement with the Nassau County Board of County Commissioners, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", for Ocean Rescue Services for Peter's Point Park, Scott Road Access, and Burney Park.

SECTION 2. The City Manager and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the Interlocal Agreement, upon review and approval by the City Attorney.

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately.

### INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR OCEAN RESCUE SERVICES

AN AGREEMENT entered into this 9th day of February, 2011, by and between the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "County", the CITY OF FERNANDINA BEACH, FLORIDA, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "City".

WHEREAS, it is the purpose and intent of this agreement for the City and the County, pursuant to Section 163.01, Florida Statutes, to cooperate and provide for a means by which each governmental entity may exercise its respective powers, privileges and authorities which they share in common and which each might exercise separately in order to further a common goal; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens and visitors of Nassau County that ocean rescue (lifeguard) services be provided by the City for the following Nassau County public beaches: Peter's Point Park, Scott Road Beach Access, and Burney Park, and any other Nassau County public beaches as determined by mutual written agreement between the City and Nassau County; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Fernandina Beach to provide ocean rescue services to Nassau County in exchange for a fee for services; and

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are hereby fully incorporated into this

Agreement by this reference.

- 2. <u>Purpose and Scope.</u> This agreement provides through the cooperation of the City and the County for the City to provide efficient ocean rescue services for County public beaches including, Peter's Point Park, Scott Road Beach Access and Burney Park, and another other County public beaches as determined by mutual written agreement of the City and the County.
- 3. <u>Term and Effective Date.</u> The term of this agreement begins October 1, 2010 and ends September 30, 2014. This Agreement shall be automatically renewed on an annual basis unless terminated in accordance with section 9 herein.
- 4. <u>Employee Status.</u> Persons employed by the City, who provide ocean rescue service for County public beaches shall remain employees of the City for purposes related to pay, benefits, pension, worker's compensation, unemployment benefits, and all other employee rights or privileges granted by law or granted by their respective employing agency.
- <u>Duties and Responsibilities.</u> City shall provide Ocean Rescue Lifeguards for Peter's Point
   Park, Scott Road Beach Access, and Burney Park:
  - A. Eight (8) Lifeguards will be the daily seasonal average staffing.
  - B. Fernandina Beach Fire-Rescue Department will maintain overall managerial control over Ocean Rescue services provided to Nassau County:
    - 1. The City will cooperate with the County Manager to meet the County's needs and address mutual concerns.
    - Fernandina Beach Fire-Rescue will have the ability to increase or decrease service levels on any given day based on weather, ocean conditions, beach attendance, or any other circumstances that could dictate service levels.
  - C. Ocean Rescue services will be provided annually on a seasonal basis beginning on the first weekend in May and will continue through Labor Day:
    - 1. Weekend service during the month of May.
    - 2. Service level will be increased to seven (7) days/week after Memorial Day and will continue at this level through Labor Day.

- Fernandina Beach Fire-Rescue will be notified by the County of any Special Events
  (i.e. Triathlon) that require additional staffing. The City will bill the promoter of the
  special event for the additional staff and equipment required for the event per City
  Ordinance.
- 6. <u>Fees.</u> The County shall pay to the City One Hundred Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$113,000.00) annually for providing ocean rescue services for County public beaches in accordance with the duties and responsibilities stated above, and the fees and costs shall be allocated by the City as follows:
  - a. Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for operating costs and one hundred three thousand dollars (\$103,000.00) for personnel;
  - b. The \$10,000.00 operating costs is a fixed annual expense, unless the City and County agree to the additional costs as provided in this Agreement, and will be due prior to the end of the first week in January each year;
  - c. The City shall bill the County for personnel expenses on a monthly basis after the season has begun. The personnel billing will be for actual costs based on the total number of lifeguards used in the preceding month. Annual personnel costs will not exceed one hundred three thousand dollars (\$103,000.00) unless the City and County agree to the additional costs as provided in this Agreement;
  - d. Personnel costs will include the hourly wage plus benefits paid to lifeguards. For the purpose of this agreement a daily rate of one hundred eighteen dollars and thirteen cents (\$118.13) per lifeguard per day (based on average lifeguard wages and benefits for the 2011 season) will be the billing rate for ocean rescue personnel services unless the City and County agree to the additional costs as provided in this Agreement;
  - e. Because the possibility of unexpected increases in the costs associated with providing Ocean Rescue services exists, both the City and the County agree to the following;
    - i. Throughout the duration of this agreement, the City shall notify the County by November 30<sup>th</sup> of each year of any increases in the costs associated with providing the services that have been described in this document above the one hundred thirteen thousand dollars (\$113,000.00) that has been guaranteed for the first year.
    - ii. The City shall provide an explanation to justify any increases in service costs. The County will have the option of accepting the City's explanation of the increase and agree to the adjusted fee for services or the County may choose to exercise the termination clause of this agreement as described under section 9 (Termination).
- 7. <u>Minor Equipment and Operating Supplies</u> (exhibit A) The County agrees to transfer ownership to the city at no cost to the City. The City shall utilize this equipment and supplies at their discretion to perform the duties and responsibilities under this agreement.
- 8. <u>Indemnification.</u> The City and County do not assume any liability for the acts, omissions

or negligence of the other party. Each party shall indemnify and hold the other harmless from all claims, damages, losses and expenses arising out of or resulting from performance of their respective duties under this Agreement. Nothing contained herein shall constitute a waiver of immunity or limitation of liability the City or County may have under the doctrine of sovereign immunity or Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

- 9. <u>Termination</u>. This agreement may be terminated, without cause, by either party. The terminating party shall give the other party at least ninety (90) days written notice of its intent to terminate and the termination date. The County shall pay the City for any and all ocean rescue services provided, including but not limited to, personnel costs, up to and including the date of termination.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FERNANDINA BEACH, FLORIDA APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE NASSAU COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR OCEAN RESCUE SERVICES ON PUBLIC BEACHES; AUTHORIZING EXECUTION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the County has determined that it is in the best interest and of the citizens and visitors of Nassau County that Ocean Rescue (Lifeguard) Services be provided by the City for the following Nassau County public beaches: Peter's Point Park, Scott Road Beach Access, and Burney Park, and

WHEREAS, the initial term of the agreement is for three (3) years; and

WHEREAS, the County shall pay to the City one hundred thirteen thousand dollars (\$113,000.00) annually in accordance with the duties and responsibilities as stated in the proposed agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Board of County Commissioners approved this Interlocal Agreement for Ocean Rescue Services at their meeting on February 9, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FERNANDINA BEACH, FLORIDA, THAT:

SECTION 1. The City Commission here approves the Interlocal Agreement with the Nassau County Board of County Commissioners, attached hereto as "Exhibit "A", for Ocean Rescue Services for Peter's Point Park, Scott Road Access, and Burney Park.

SECTION 2. The City Manager and City Clerk are herby authorized to execute the Interlocal Agreement, upon review and approval by the City Attorney.

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately.
