WHEREAS, the Board and the Consultant entered into an Agreement on November 21, 2016 to provide professional engineering design services for the Pages Dairy Road/Chester Road Intersection Improvements project - Chester Road resurfacing, Pages Dairy Road widening and Chester Road at Pages Dairy Road intersection improvements; and

WHEREAS, the original Agreement provided for an initial performance period beginning November 21, 2016 and ending November 20, 2018, with an option to extend upon mutual agreement between the Consultant and the County; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 2017, the parties agreed to amend the original Agreement adding additional services to the original Scope of Services, including the resurfacing of an additional 2,000' of Chester Road, redesigning the Pages Dairy Road/Chester Road intersection as an Urban design and Felmor Road/Pages Dairy Road intersection improvements and widening; and

WHEREAS, on December 26, 2018, the parties agreed to amend the original Agreement extending the performance period from November 21, 2018 to May 21, 2019 to allow for additional time to complete the additional services; and

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2019, the parties agreed to amend the original Agreement again adding additional services to the original Scope of Services, including geotechnical exploration, structural design and civil design to address subsurface issues; and

WHEREAS, on July 26, 2019, the parties agreed that additional time was needed to complete the additional services added to the original Scope of Services and extended the performance period from May 22, 2019 to May 21, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2019, the parties agreed to amend the original Agreement adding additional services to the original Scope of Services, including the JEA watermain design. The County was reimbursed by JEA for the costs expended for the watermain design; and

WHEREAS, on January 13, 2020, the parties agreed to amend the original Agreement revising the Scope of Services to include signalization and mast arm design for unknown signal facilities at David Hallman Parkway; and

WHEREAS, on July 9, 2020, the parties agreed that additional time was needed to complete the additional services added to the original Scope of Services and extended the performance period from May 22, 2020 to December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on December 22, 2020, the parties agreed to extend the performance period from January 1, 2021 to May 31, 2021 to allow the Consultant additional time to complete the Pages Dairy Road/Chester Road intersection improvements due to a delay in coordination with CSX for crossing signal upgrades; and

WHEREAS, the parties extended the performance period of the Agreement for an additional one (1) year from June 1, 2021 to May 31, 2022 to allow the Consultant additional time to complete post-design services with respect to the Pages Dairy Road/Chester Road intersection improvements; and

WHEREAS, the agreement entered into on February 3, 2022 with First Coast Railroad

allows until December 30, 2022 to complete the review of the engineering plans with respect to

crossing signal upgrades at the Pages Dairy Road/Chester Road intersection, and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to extend the performance period of the Agreement for an

additional one (1) year beginning June 1, 2022 and ending May 31, 2023 to allow the

Consultant additional time to complete the engineering design plans with respect to the

INSURANCE COMMITTEE MEETING March 25, 10:30 A.M. COUNTY COMMISSION CHAMBERS JAMES S. PAGE GOVERNMENTAL COMPLEX YULEE, FLORIDA

An Insurance Committee meeting was held this 25th day of March 2022 at 10:00 a.m. in the Commission Chambers, James S. Page Governmental Complex, Yulee, Florida. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the current 2022 employee insurance benefits, ancillary benefits renewal timeline, and plan recommendations for the upcoming 2023 benefit plan year.

Insurance Committee voting representatives present were John Drew, Tax Collector (arrived 10:17 a.m.); Michael Hickox, Property Appraiser; John A. Crawford, Clerk of Court; Janet Adkins, Supervisor of Elections; Marshall Eyerman, Assistant County Manager; Bobby Lippleman, Sheriff's Designee; Michael Drawdy, Clerk's Chief Deputy/Compliance and Accountability; and Taco Pope, County Manager.

Also present were Jon Hooper, Undersheriff; Darron Ayscue, President of the Local 3101 Union; Ashley Metz, County Human Resources Director; Laura Scott, County Employee Benefits Coordinator; Teresa Anderson and Travis Cummings, representing The Bailey Group; and Heather Nazworth, recording secretary.

Mr. Crawford called the meeting to order at 10:07 a.m.

Ms. Teresa Anderseon provided a PowerPoint presentation and handout to each Committee member regarding the Employee Benefits Review. Ms. Anderson referenced the meeting held on March 2, 2022, regarding the Aetna Renewal for 2023 and the request for the flat renewal. She stated that the flat renewal would be with no plan design changes, and there was discussion regarding a group of doctors to add to the plan. She informed the Board that Aetna is still looking into adding the group of doctors requested and will provide an update when the information is available. She referenced a previous discussion regarding the retirees' group that live out of state. The underwriting team at Aetna has agreed that for individuals who have enrolled in the ACO2500 and are out of state, an additional plan will be added with no additional rate changes.

Ms. Anderson discussed the plan design changes and the two plans with the highest enrollment. She stated that for the HMO1000, a request was made to change the deductible and the co-insurance, which would drop the deductible to 750/1500 per family and co-insurance to 90/10. The ACO2500 request was made to change the deductible to 2000/6000 per family and co-insurance 90/10, with a 3.8 percent increase to the rates if Aetna agrees to the plan changes. Further discussion ensued regarding the plan changes.

Mr. Cummings requested a recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners regarding the changes in the medical and keeping the ancillary insurances the same.

It was moved by Mr. Lippelman and second by Mr. Crawford and unanimously carried to move forward with the ancillary coverages as previously determined for the next year.

Mr. Pope discussed the plans' price increase and the family plan's impacts. Mr. Cummings continued the discussion regarding the increase and employee contributions. Mr. Pope discussed the data provided and needs analysis for the cost on the County for the proposed richer plans and keep the rate flat for the employees. He stated that the goal is to improve the retention with the County. The group continued to discuss the flat rate for employees, Heath Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA) and Health Savings Account (HAS) plans.

It was moved by Ms. Adkins and second by Mr. Hickox and unanimously carried to recommend to the Board of County Commissioners to stay with a flat plan with a zero percent increase with an HRA component.

Mr. Eyerman inquired if the Committee would prefer to see the HRA component prior to being submitted to the Board of County Commissioners.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:44 a.m.
