**AMENDMENT NO. 03 TO THE INTERLOCAL
AGREEMENT FOR OCEAN RESCUE SERVICES**

THIS AMENDMENT made and entered into this 3rd day of August, 2022 by and between the **Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and **City of Fernandina Beach, Florida**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "City".

WHEREAS, the parties entered into an Agreement dated February 9, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provided for an initial term of four (4) years beginning October 1, 2010 and ending September 30, 2014, which shall be automatically renewed on an annual basis unless terminated in accordance with Section 9 (Termination) of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into subsequent renewal periods for the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement was amended and increased by \$5,000 for personnel cost November 27, 2017 in accordance to Section 6 (e); and

WHEREAS, the Agreement was amended and a second increase by \$17,000.00 October 1, 2020 for personnel cost arising from demand placed on these services due to warmer temperatures and the need for a longer season in accordance to Section 6 (e); and

WHEREAS, the parties also amended season services detailed in Section 5 (c) of the Agreement to begin the first weekend in March replacing the original season start date of the first weekend in May and extending service levels to seven days/week after Memorial Day and continuing after Labor Day through the end of September; and


WHEREAS, the Agreement will automatically renew on October 1, 2022 for a period of one year and the parties desire to amend the Agreement to allow for a third increase in the amount of \$66,000.00 annually beginning October 1, 2022 because of rising operating expenses and the demand placed on these services due to warmer temperatures, rising employee cost and the need for a longer season in accordance to Section 6 (e).

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The Agreement shall be amended to increase costs by \$66,000.00 annually beginning October 1, 2022 as requested in the letter dated May 12, 2022 attached as Attachment "A". The new annual cost shall be \$201,000.00.
2. All other provisions of said Agreement not in conflict with this Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.





Dear Mr. Pope:

Amid rising Ocean Rescue operating expenses and the demand placed on these services due to warmer temperatures, rising employee cost and the need for a longer season, the City of Fernandina Beach is requesting an amendment to contract CM1721 entered on February 9, 2011. The following amendments to said contract are being requested for the **2022/2023** Ocean Rescue season:

1. Increase the amount of the above contract to two hundred one thousand dollars (\$201,000.00) and extend said contract through September 30, 2023.
2. Ocean Rescue Services will be provided annually on a seasonal basis beginning the first weekend in March and continuing through Labor Day at the following service levels:
 - a. Weekend service in March through Memorial Day.
 - b. Service levels will increase to seven days/week after Memorial Day through Labor Day.

Ocean Rescue services on City beaches are scheduled (in 2023) to continue after Labor Day through the end of September. If County officials desire extended Ocean Rescue services to correspond with the services provided within the City, please contact Chief Silcox, Fernandina Beach Fire Department, for additional information.
