

RESOLUTION 90 - 103

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES GRANT TO NASSAU COUNTY A LEASE OF STATE-OWNED PROPERTY ON THE SOUTH END OF AMELIA ISLAND AND, FURTHER, THAT THE DEPARTMENT CONTINUE TO ALLOW VEHICULAR TRAFFIC ON THE ATLANTIC OCEAN AND NASSAU SOUND BEACHES ADJACENT TO THE STATE-OWNED PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Division of the Department of Natural Resources owns approximately two hundred fifty (250) acres of land on the south end of Amelia Island; and

WHEREAS, the continued access to the south end of Amelia Island by the citizens of Nassau County is a vital concern of the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, vehicular access on the Atlantic Ocean and Nassau Sound beaches is critical to the access to the south end; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Nassau County that the Board lease the property subject to the State's approval of improvements thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 22nd day of May, 1990, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:

1. That the Division of Parks and Recreation endorse and approve the County's lease of said property.


2. That the Department of Natural Resources continue to allow vehicular traffic on the Atlantic Ocean and Nassau Sound beaches adjacent to the south end park.

3. That the Department immediately commence negotiations with the County regarding the lease of said property.

4. The Department within thirty (30) days, in writing, permit vehicular access on the Atlantic Ocean and Nassau Sound beaches.


Unanimously adopted this 22nd day of May, 1990.
