

ORDINANCE NO. 92 - 5

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 82-3, WHICH CREATED COURT SERVICE CHARGES FOR NASSAU COUNTY, INCLUDING COUNTY AND CIRCUIT COURT; SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION I; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on or about July 13, 1982, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 82-3, which created Court service charges for Nassau County, including County and Circuit Court cases; and

WHEREAS, the Board has found it necessary to increase the fees charged.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED this 27th day of January, 1992, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, that Ordinance 82-3 shall be amended as follows:

1. SECTION I: The fees listed below shall be charged by the Clerk for the County and Circuit Court and said fees shall be in addition to those allowable by law:

(a) County - Civil

Small Claims

Claims of less than \$100.00 \$ ~~2.00~~ 10.00

Claims of \$100.00 and less than \$1,000.00 ~~4.00~~ 10.00

Claims of \$1,000.00 or more ~~8.00~~ 10.00

(b) Circuit Court - Civil

Civil action, proceedings or

claims of ~~\$2,500.00~~ \$10,000.00 or more \$ ~~10.00~~ 20.00


(c) Circuit Court - Probate

Opening Estate \$ ~~4.00~~ 10.00

Petition, Admission of Wills	10.00 <u>20.00</u>
Summary Administration (less than \$10,000.00 Estate	
Estate	10.00 <u>20.00</u>
Family Administration (\$10,000.00, but less than \$60,000.00	
Formal Administration, guardianship, ancillary, curatorship or conservatorship proceedings with an inventory below \$60,000.00	10.00 <u>20.00</u>
Formal Administration, guardianship, ancillary, curatorship or conservatorship proceedings with an inventory of \$60,000.00, but less than \$100,000.00	10.00 <u>20.00</u>
Petition for determination of competency	4.00 <u>10.00</u>
