ORDINANCE NO. 2000-07

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 94-1, AS AMENDED, WHICH ESTABLISHED THE SOUTH AMELIA ISLAND SHORE STABILIZATION MUNICIPAL BENEFIT UNIT; SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 4, GOVERNING BODY, ADVISORY BOARD; ELIMINATING THE ADVISORY BOARD; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the MSBU Advisory Board is no longer necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED this <u>20th</u> day of March, 2000, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, that Ordinance No. 94-1 shall be amended as follows:

1. SECTION 4 - GOVERNING BODY; ADVISORY BOARD

T

- (a) The BOCC shall be the governing body of the MSBU.
- (b) There is hereby created an Advisory Board to the BOCC concerning the beach nourishment program on Amelia Island to be undertaken by the MSBU. The Advisory Board shall be composed of seven (7) individuals owning real property located within the boundaries of the MSBU. The Advisory Board shall adopt procedures by which it shall operate and it shall elect a chair and vice chair and such other officers as it deems necessary. The Advisory Board members shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners on an annual basis and may be re-appointed. The appointment date shall be set by the Board of County Commissioners. No individual may serve two (2) consecutive terms as the chair or vice chair. All members of the Advisory Board shall serve without compensation. The Advisory Board shall review proposals for the beach nourishment program, including the levy of special assessments to finance such program, and may make such recommendations to the BOCC as it deems necessary and appropriate.

 This Ordinance shall become effective upon its being filed in the Secretary of State's Office.
