RESOLUTION OFFERING BY-PASS ROAD IN LIEU OF CONSTRUCTION OF DETOUR AND BRIDGE AT LITTLE ST. MARYS RIVER IN CONSTRUCTION OF SECTION 74560 S-121-A KNOWN AS MIDDLE ROAD IN NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA.

WHEREAS, this Board has been informed by R. L. King,
County Engineer, that the plans for the construction of Section
74560 S-121-A (Middle Road), provides for the construction of a
detour with a bridge at the crossing of Little St. Marys River
which would cost in excess of \$20,000.00, which detour would be
of a temporary nature and of no value to the construction of said
road, thereby increasing the cost of the project in such amount,
and

WHEREAS, Rayonier Incorporated has offered to permit the County to use their private Road No. 39 connecting the Middle Road at a point Northerly from Little St. Marys River to an intersection with the Lessie Road, provided the County will maintain said road in its present condition and to place said road in as good condition as it now is when same is no longer needed as a by-pass road, and

WHEREAS, this Board does not wish to do a useless thing and would not obtain and maintain said road as a by-pass road unless it would eliminate the necessity of the contractor building a bridge and detour road for its own purposes and unless it would save the project a substantial amount of money, and

WHEREAS, it is the purpose of this Resolution to offer the facilities of this by-pass road if so desired by the State Road Department for the purpose of eliminating from the contract the necessity of building a detour road and bridge and will

so authorized by the State Road Department provided a saving will be made in the construction cost of the project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, in special meeting
duly assembled, that Nassau County will make available and
maintain a by-pass road from the Middle Road to the Lessie
Road as described in the preamble hereof at the authorization
of the State Road Department upon the assurance that said by-pass
road will eliminate the necessity of a detour road and thereby
reduce the cost of the construction of said project.

This Cooperative Agreement by and between Massau County Board of County Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as the COOPERATOR, and the Florida Board of Forestry, an Agency of the State of Florida, by its Agent, hereinafter referred to as the FOREST SERVICE.

### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the County of Nassau did on December 15, 1948, enter into a County Fire Control Agreement with the Florida Board of Forestry for the protection of its forest and wild lands; and

WHEREAS, the control of timber, grass, and wild-land fires in, and adjacent to, suburban areas is essential to an effective forest fire control program; and

WHEREAS, the COOPERATOR is actively engaged in the prevention and suppression of all fires in, and adjacent to, suburban areas; and

WHEREAS, the COOPERATOR can more adequately carry out this function if additional equipment is available; and

WHEREAS, the FOREST SERVICE, from time to time, has a limited number of units of fire fighting equipment that can

be made available to other agencies involved in fire control work; and WHEREAS, it has been determined to be advantageous to the POREST SERVICE in the proper discharge of its responsibilities as described and set forth in Chapter 590, Plorida Statutes, to make certain equipment available to the COOPERATOR: NOW, THEREFORE, the parties to this agreement do hereby agree as follows: TERROR BEAT A THE POREST SERVICE AGREES: (1) To make available the equipment described on the attached addenda, according to the terms set forth in the addenda and in this agreement, (2) That the title to all accessories, tools, equipment, sirens, etc. which are added to the equipment will remain with the COOPERATOR and the COOPERATOR may remove same, prior to returning the equipment to the FOREST SERVICE. THE COOPERATOR AGREES: To maintain current liability and property damage insurance for each piece of equipment listed on the addenda. (2) To make the equipment available for inspection quarterly by a representative of the FOREST SERVICE. (3) That the equipment may not be sold, junked, or traded, but must be returned to the FOREST SERVICE for final disposition. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED: The permanent Florida Forest Service license plate will continue to be used on the equipment. (2) The equipment will be marked in a manner that will indicate the cooperation between the COOPERATOR and the FOREST SERVICE.

This agreement will be effective from the date of execution by the State Forester and will continue in force from year to year unless terminated by either party by thirty (30) days written notice to the other, provided, however, that all of the provisions herein are complied with.
