

RESOLUTION NO. 55

RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING NEED FOR BEACH EROSION STUDY OF THE SHORES OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, BY THE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC WORKS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES.

WHEREAS, based upon a preliminary investigation conducted by the U. S. Corps of Engineers, it has been determined that there is a need for a complete Beach erosion study for the shores of Nassau County, Florida, and

WHEREAS, the said U. S. Corps of Engineers has recommended that a resolution be adopted calling for such a study to be made, and

WHEREAS, Honorable Don Fuqua, Congressman for this District has been diligent in urging that this matter be considered for study, and

WHEREAS, such a study appears to be necessary in the interest of Beach Erosion, Hurricane protection and related purposes, and

WHEREAS, it further appears that such study should also include consideration of repairs to the North and South Jetties of the Fernandina Beach Harbor Entrance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the need for such a study is urgent and that this Board recommends that, based upon the preliminary Investigation conducted by the U. S. Corps of Engineers, it is deemed expedient and necessary that a complete study be instigated in this matter, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Honorable Don Fuqua, Congressman, for his handling with the Committee of Public Works of the House of Representatives of the United States.
