

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, under the provisions Chapter 145.022, as enacted into law by 1973 Florida State Legislature, the Tax Collector is required to establish a budget for that office, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 69-346, Par. 145.022 provides that by mutual consent of the Board of County Commissioners and the Tax Collector that the Tax Collector may be placed on a budget system rather than the fee system, providing the fees collected by the Tax Collector are delivered to the Board of County Commissioners, and

WHEREAS, the Tax Collector and the Board of County Commissioners, Nassau County, Florida, have mutually agreed to such an arrangement.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, in lawful session duly assembled, that,

1. The Tax Collector of Nassau County, Florida be placed on a salary in the amount designated by Chapter 73-173, H.B. 2144, Chapter 145.11 (1) Florida Statutes.
2. That the office of Tax Collector shall operate on a budget system, submitted by the Tax Collector to the Board of County Commissioners as outlined in Chapter 145.022.
3. The fiscal year of the office of Tax Collector is hereby established to be beginning October 1, and ending September 30, each year.
4. The Tax Collector shall receive from the Board of County Commissioners 1/6 of the total appropriated amount at the first meeting of the Board in October and 1/12 each month thereafter until the total appropriation is received.
5. The funds allocated for the Tax Collector shall be a lawful budgetary and appropriate item of the County Government.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution, be furnished the Tax Collector, State Comptroller, Auditor General and spread upon the official minutes of the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida.
