

RESOLUTION NO. 77-222

WHEREAS, the United States of America, through the United States Army Corps of Engineers, has approved a plan to restore an eroded beach front and provide hurricane protection to the upland property, provided an erosion control line is established, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 161, Florida Statutes, empowers the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund to establish said erosion control line at the request of the authorized local government, provided the owners of more than 50% of the number of lineal feet of property abutting the proposed line consent thereto in writing; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner has hereto caused a survey to be made to establish a proposed erosion control line preliminary to the implementation of the beach restoration program pursuant to Section 161.161 Florida Statutes, and has received written consent approving the line from the owners of more than 50% of the number of lineal feet of property lying between the north boundary line of Sadler Road and the south boundary line of Fort Clinch State Park property, a distance of approximately 20,000 feet, and


WHEREAS, the petitioner has approved said proposed erosion control line and desires that said Board take the several actions required to comply with said Section,


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commission of Nassau County, Florida in a special meeting held on the 17th day of November, 1977, that the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund be and are hereby petitioned to take whatever action necessary to establish the surveyed line, as shown on the attached survey plat, as the beach erosion control line from the north boundary of Sadler Road to the south boundary of Fort Clinch State Park, a distance of approximately 20,000 feet, along the shores of the Atlantic Ocean.
