NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, does hereby oppose the passage of Senate Bill 35 for the following reasons:

- 1. Senate Bill 35 will eliminate the common law concept of sovereign immunity of state and local governments from liability under Section 1983 of the United States Code.
- 2. The passage of Senate Bill 35 would have substantial adverse impact on the budget of Nassau County and other local and state governments by virtue of authorizing the award of money damages against local and state governments.
- 3. By making state and local governments further liable for money damages for "injury to reputation", Senate Bill 35 would further strain the budgets of county governments.
- 4. Senate Bill 35 would encourage litigation by authorizing the award of attorneys' fees on behalf of plaintiffs' attorneys in suits under Section 1983 against local governments and would impact county budgets with attorneys' fees in defending all such suits.

5. The total financial impact of Senate Bill 35 on Nassau County could well result in the substantial impairment or destruction of the financial integrity and ability of the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, strongly urges the United States Senate and particularly the Senators from Florida, The Honorable Lawton Chiles and The Honorable Richard Stone to vote against Senate Bill 35.


