WHEREAS, human rights and good human relations are the result of preserving, protecting and perpetuating the rights of each individual's freedom, dignity and pride; and,


WHEREAS, the accomplishments and contributions of all members of our communities enjoying the harmonious social climate of the Sunshine State deserve recognition;
