

RESOLUTION NO. 84-31

WHEREAS, the dune structure of Amelia Island from its Northernmost to Southernmost point is immediately threatened to be destroyed by erosion, and

WHEREAS, there are many causes for this erosion from the actions of man to the wind and wave actions of nature, and

WHEREAS, there will be approximately twenty million cubic yards of material available for dune and beach renourishment available due to the Navy and Corps of Engineers dredging to deepen Cumberland Sound and seaward, and

WHEREAS, there is no commitment by the Navy to place these materials on the beaches of Amelia Island;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, that the State of Florida, through the Department of Natural Resources Division of Beaches and Shores, be requested to fund a grant to Nassau County to seek, through a study, innovative and economical ways to place these materials on the beaches of Amelia Island.
