- At this time all counties within the region are disposing of their waste within their own county.
- 3. With population growth the amount of solid waste produced will be proportional.
- 4. All costs associated with solid waste disposal will continue to increase.
- 5. On a county by county basis the cost of disposing of solid waste is becoming unendurable.
- Regional methods for disposing of solid waste along with methods for reducing the amount of solid waste entering landfills must be found.
- 7. Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council Solid Waste Study from January 1987 recommended further studies to:

a. establish the feasibility of individual county landfill expansion verses various county cooperative programs for centralization,

b. establish the most cost effective alternative tolandfill expansion for each county, concentrating onrefuse-to-energy and composting techniques,c. plan for centralization of landfill usage with

intercounty cooperative agreements.
