

RESOLUTION 91 - 1

A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THAT A PROPOSITION CALLING FOR SINGLE MEMBER REPRESENTATION WITHIN THE COUNTY COMMISSION DISTRICTS BE SUBMITTED TO THE ELECTORATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 124.011, Florida Statutes, the Board of County Commissioners may submit, to the electors of the County, a proposition calling for single member districts; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners believes that the voters should have the option to vote for five (5) County Commissioners elected by district only or the Commission should be at-large as they are now.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 5th day of October, 1990, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:

1. The Supervisor of Elections is hereby directed to place on the ballot, for the general election to be held this year, as follows:

Shall the five (5) members of the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, be elected to office from single-member districts by electors residing in each of those districts only?
