

RESOLUTION 91-33

WHEREAS, driving under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances (DUI) resulted in 1,540 fatalities and 35,371 injuries on Florida's highways in 1989; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that alcohol was involved in one half of all boating fatalities; and


WHEREAS, the Florida Highway Patrol, Florida Marine Patrol, Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, Florida Sheriff's Departments, and city police departments throughout the state have exhibited leadership in protecting the public from the DUI problem; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Community Affairs, Bureau of Public Safety Management is providing assistance in the development of community-based traffic safety programs with DUI emphasis; and


WHEREAS, the Nassau County Board of County Commissioners feel that the use of alcohol or controlled substances while operating motor vehicles can best be combatted by the local community and an informed citizenry that understands the perils of driving while impaired and the penalties that are imposed in Florida's DUI statutes.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Nassau County Board of County Commissioners this 27th day of November, 1990 that the week of December 9 through 15, 1990 is hereby proclaimed as "DRUNK AND DRUGGED DRIVING AWARENESS WEEK".

The Board further urges all citizens in Nassau County to become more cognizant of the dangers associated with intoxicated drivers and to support the fight against driving while under the influence of alcohol and other drugs on Nassau County highways.
