NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT NEED


Nassau County is located north of Duval County, and has a population of approximately 49,000 residents. The County has approximately seven (7) miles of beach which all of our county residents, along with thousands of visitors, enjoy during the year.

The Nassau County Board of County Commissioners have set beach access and preservation as one of their top priorities. This past year, they have constructed two (2) beach parks which ensure accessibility for Nassau County residents and other visitors to this county. These parks will offer residents parking facilities along with bathhouses.


The proposed dune walkover project will provide two (2) dunewalkers and sand fencing. This project is located within walking distance of Burney Road Beach Park which is located on the south end of our county. This beach park provides approximately 200 parking spaces for beach goers that do not reside in this area.


Both proposed walkovers will be built on 10' easements as shown on the plat (Attachment I) of American Beach. Beach area was platted and developed by the Afro American Pension Bureau Incorporated in 1945, and has served as one of Florida's most popular beach area for Florida's black residents. area serves residents of the county year round and thousands of visitors during the year. Located on both sides of this area are private resort developments which provide access to the beach for their residents and guests only. These resort areas are not open to the general public; therefore, public access to the county beach area is limited. Approximately 4 miles of the 7 miles of county beaches have restricted access and the Board of County Commissioners propose to enhance the American Beach area by building these two (2) dune walkovers to ensure county residents and visitors not staying at these resort developments adequate access to the Atlantic Beaches located within Nassau County.

This project is part of the Board of County Commissioners plan to ensure adequate beach access to all county residents and visitors. The proposed dune walkovers and sand fencing, will provide beach users with an access method which will protect the dune system and help save our most beautiful natural resources for years to come, so it can be enjoyed by future generations.
