
- Provide the required local share estimated to be \$223,733.00, including impact related growth expenditures since 1985.

PROJECT NARRATIVE

1 .

The Nassau County Board of County Commissioners are requesting Community Impact Assistance funds for Phase II, in the expansion program for the Yulee Ball Park, a 9.83 acre tract. The Yulee Ball Park is located one (1) block east of U.S. 17, and north of Pages Dairy road, on Lewis Street (See Attachment I) adjacent to the Yulee Primary School. The present facilities at the park include one (1) football field, two (2) youth baseball fields, one (1) adult baseball field and a restroom facility.

At the present time 10.5% of NSB, Kings Bay military personnel and civilians reside in Nassau County. This percentage will be maintained as base manpower grows. Approximately twothirds of the above percentage of base personnel live in the unincorporated areas of Nassau County, while one-third reside on Amelia Island. The NSB-connected population of Nassau County (both direct and secondary) has been projected to increase to 3,633 people by fiscal year 1998.

This park is located in an area which has been greatly impacted by growth as a direct result of Kings Bay employees locating in the general proximity. Since this is the only existing facility for recreational activities for our youth and or adults off of Amelia Island, other than those located twentyto-thirty miles away in Callahan or Hilliard, it is most imperative that this facility be upgraded. This park houses both Yulee Little League and the Yulee Athletic Association (Pop Warner Pootball), and all fields are being scheduled for the maximum number of games permissible per day.

During the last three (3) years, the Little League has grown from an enrollment of two hundred (200) children to four hundred-fifty (450) children per year, which represents a 80% increase in participation. The Pop Warner Football program which began approximately seven years ago has averaged approximately one hundred-fifty (150) children per year, however this program has increased this year to two hundred (200) children, which represents a 33% increase in participation for this sport. With such a marked increase in participation in the various sports activities, there is a definite need for expansion in order for this park to continue to provide the recreational activities needed.

The first phase of this expansion of this park over the last five (5) years has been approximately \$114,756. The two parcels which the park is located on, has an assessed value of \$108,977.00.

The second phase of the park's expansion with the requested Community Impact Assistance funds would provide for the construction of Phase II's improvements as identified in the attached Budget Analysis.
