

RESOLUTION 92-82

RESOLUTION OF THE NASSAU COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OPPOSING THE PROPOSED HRS RESTRUCTURING BILL, REQUESTING THAT HRS BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE LOCAL BASED CONTROL WITH SINGLE POINTS OF ACCOUNTABILITY, REQUESTING THAT HRS BE PROHIBITED FROM CREATING ANY REGIONAL PROCESSING CENTERS, AND REQUESTING THAT HRS BE PROHIBITED FROM CREATING ANY ADDITIONAL LAYERS OF BUREAUCRACY.

WHEREAS, the proposed HRS Restructuring Bill will create four (4) Regional Processing Centers; and

WHEREAS, the creation of new Regional Processing Centers will create a new layer of bureaucracy at a time when HRS should return to local based control; and

WHEREAS, the proposed new Regional Processing Centers will increase overhead and capital cost without providing any additional services to the general public; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Regional Processing Centers will result in no net economic cost savings to the State of Florida and may decrease employee productivity through increased paperwork and correspondence; and

WHEREAS, the proposed new Regional Processing Centers will displace between six hundred and seven hundred employees during a time of economic recession; and

WHEREAS, the proposed new Regional Processing Centers will make HRS less responsive to the needs of the general public; and

WHEREAS, the proposed HRS Restructuring Bill is contrary to the recommendations of the HRS Restructuring Task Force Committee; and

WHEREAS, the proposed regional centralization of purchasing decisions will have a devastating impact on the economy of Nassau County and other small counties.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Nassau County Commission that:

1. The proposed HRS Restructuring Bill should be defeated by the Florida Legislature.
2. HRS should be required to provide local based control with single points of accountability.
3. HRS should be prohibited from creating any Regional Processing Centers.


4. HRS should be prohibited from creating any additional layers of bureaucracy.
