WHEREAS, Nassau County has experienced the profound impact of rising juvenile delinquency; and


WHEREAS, the failure to allocate funds for additional supervisory personnel for the Department of Juvenile Justice could result in Nassau County staff members reporting to supervisors in the larger Jacksonville unit; and

WHEREAS, such a system would seriously impair the efficacy which is sought through creation of the new Department.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 11th day of July, 1994, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:


