RESOLUTION 95 - 60

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT THE LEGISLATURE INCREASE THE POPULATION REQUIREMENT FOR SMALL COUNTY BENEFITS.

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has enacted legislation providing certain benefits to small counties; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has defined small counties as those with a population of 50,000 or less as of April 1, 1992; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Nassau County have benefitted from small county legislation; and

WHEREAS, given the increase in population for the State of Florida, small counties should be defined as those with a population of 75,000 or less.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 23 day of January, 1995, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:

- 1. That the Board of County Commissioners hereby requests the Legislative Delegation amend the small county legislation to increase the population from 50,000 or less to 75,000 or less, and if a date is necessary, to make the date April 1, 1994, or April 1, 1995.
- 2. That this Resolution be sent to Senator Charles Williams and Representative George Crady.
