RESOLUTION 2000 - 111

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY RESTRICTING OUT OF COUNTY RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AT BEACHFRONT PARKS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF AMELIA ISLAND; PROVIDING PENALTIES; PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, adopted Ordinance 94-22, the Nassau County Recreational Land Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the County has four (4) beachfront areas where vehicles may park, and people may access the Atlantic Ocean beaches; and

WHEREAS, the parking areas are owned and controlled by Nassau County; and

WHEREAS, the Board has been made aware that increasing numbers of out of County recreational vehicles are utilizing the beachfront parks, and thereby restricting their use by Nassau County residents; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds it to be in the best interest of the citizens of Nassau County to control out of County recreational vehicles utilizing beachfront parks.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, this 19th day of June, 2000, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:

- 1. The areas designated for parking of vehicles for access to the Atlantic Ocean beach areas are:
 - a. Peters Point Park
 - b. Scott Road Parking Area
 - c. Burney Park
- d. Dunes Club Parking area and walkover, located south of the Amelia Island Plantation entrance.
- 2. Recreational-type vehicles with tags not issued in Nassau County shall not be allowed to remain in any of the areas set forth herein between sundown to sunup if they are occupied and/or used as temporary living quarters for recreational or camping use.
- 3. Any recreational-type vehicle with tags not issued in Nassau County shall be allowed in the areas set forth herein from sunup to sundown only, and only in designated parking areas.
- 4. Recreational-type vehicles are those primarily designated as temporary living quarters for recreational camping or travel use, which either has its own motor power or is mounted on or drawn by another vehicle. This includes travel trailers, camping trailer, truck campers, motor homes, private motor coaches, van conversions, or park trailers, and all are further defined in Florida Statutes, Section 320.01.

- 5. A violation of the provisions of this Resolution shall be as set forth in Ordinance 94-22, a second-degree misdemeanor, punishable by ten (10) days at the Nassau. County Detention Facility and/or a five hundred dollar (\$500.00) fine for each infraction.
- 6. Appropriate signs shall be posted by the Public Works Department indicating parking and prohibitions as set forth herein.
