

RESOLUTION NO. 2000-35

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, IN OPPOSITION TO ANY PROPOSED
LEGISLATION WHICH ATTEMPTS TO CUT THE INTANGIBLE TAX**

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, has been made aware of legislation which proposes cuts in the intangible tax; and

WHEREAS, there are several Bills filed that propose such cuts. They are HB 187; SB 60; SB 204; HB 67; HB 425; as well as the Governor's proposed intangible tax reduction; and

WHEREAS, Nassau County could lose approximately \$398,560.00 if HB 187 were adopted; approximately \$220,240.00 if SB 60 were adopted; approximately \$804,713.00 if HB 425 and SB 906 were adopted; and approximately \$751,171.00 if the Governor's proposed intangible tax reduction passes; and

WHEREAS, Nassau County cannot afford to lose those amounts.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED this 20th day of March, 2000, that the Board of County Commissioners hereby:

1. Request that the Representative George Crady and Senator Richard Mitchell attempt to ensure that these Bills, or any similar Bills, or legislative proposals do not pass during this Legislative Session.
2. Directs that a copy of this Resolution be sent to all counties in the State of Florida urging that they pass a similar resolution.

3. Directs that a copy of this Resolution be delivered to the respective members of the legislature and staff.


