> A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA ELECTING TO USE THE UNIFORM METHOD OF COLLECTING NON-AD VALOREM SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS LEVIED WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY; STATING A NEED FOR SUCH LEVY; PROVIDING FOR THE MAILING OF THIS RESOLUTION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida (the "County") is contemplating the imposition of special assessments for the provision of (i) beach renourishment; (ii) capital improvements including water and wastewater, road resurfacing, neighborhood park improvements, beautification and maintenance of rights-of-way, subdivision wall construction and maintenance, subdivision entranceway construction and maintenance, street lighting and sidewalks; (iii) water and wastewater facilities improvements; (iv) solid waste disposal services; and

WHEREAS, the County intends to use the uniform method for collecting non-ad valorem special assessments for the cost of providing (i) beach renourishment; (ii) capital improvements including water and wastewater, road resurfacing, neighborhood park improvements, beautification and maintenance of rights-of-way, subdivision wall construction and maintenance, subdivision entranceway construction and maintenance, street lighting and sidewalks; (iii) water and wastewater facilities improvements; (iv) solid waste disposal services to property within the unincorporated area of the County as authorized by Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, as amended, because this method will allow such special assessments to be collected annually commencing in November 2002, in the same manner as provided for ad valorem taxes; and

WHEREAS, the County held a duly advertised public hearing prior to the adoption of this Resolution, proof of publication of such hearing being attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, this <u>17th</u> day of December, 2001 as follows:

- Commencing with the Fiscal Year beginning on October 1, 2002, and 1. with the tax statement mailed for such Fiscal Year, the County intends to use the uniform method of collecting non-ad valorem assessments authorized in Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, as amended, for collecting non-ad valorem assessments for the cost of providing (i) beach renourishment; (ii) capital improvements including water and wastewater, road resurfacing, neighborhood park improvements, beautification and maintenance of rights-ofway, subdivision wall construction and maintenance, subdivision entranceway construction and maintenance, street lighting and sidewalks; (iii) water and wastewater facilities improvements; (iv) solid waste disposal services. Such non-ad valorem assessments shall be levied within the unincorporated and incorporated areas of the County. A legal description of such area subject to the assessment is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated by reference.
- 2. The County hereby determines that the levy of the assessments is needed to fund the cost of (i) beach renourishment; (ii) capital improvements including water and wastewater, road resurfacing, neighborhood park improvements, beautification and maintenance of rights-of-way, subdivision wall construction and maintenance, subdivision entranceway construction and maintenance, street

lighting and sidewalks; (iii) water and wastewater facilities improvements; (iv) solid waste disposal services within the unincorporated area of the County.

- 3. Upon adoption, the County Clerk is hereby directed to send a copy of this Resolution by United States Mail to the Florida Department of Revenue, the Nassau County Tax Collector, and the Nassau County Property Appraiser by January 10, 2002.
- 4. The Board of County Commissioners shall not, at its request, impose an assessment under the authority of this Resolution. The method set forth in this Resolution shall only be considered and utilized if a neighborhood, association, group, etc., requests that the Board of County Commissioners utilize this method.
- This Resolution shall become effective upon adoption.
