RESOLUTION 2001 - 27

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS URGING THE STATE TO "FAST TRACK" A PROJECT TO PROTECT THE SOUTH END OF AMELIA ISLAND, NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA.

WHEREAS, the State and the Board of County Commissioners have declared a State of Emergency as to the erosion of the shoreline on the South End of Amelia Island; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is vitally concerned with the loss of oceanfront shoreline; and

WHEREAS, the erosion is of such a nature that it requires immediate attention; and

WHEREAS, the loss of State-owned oceanfront property and the effect on other private and public property would have serious long-term effects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 29th day of January, 2001, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:

- 1. The Board urges the State to "fast track" a project to protect the South End of Amelia Island.
- 2. The Board encourages the State to provide all appropriate funds for a project to address the South End of Amelia Island, both in the short-term and the long-term.

3. That copies of this Resolution be provided to the Governor, the President of the Florida Senate, the Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives, Senator Mitchell, and Representative Bean.
