A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, RECOGNIZING THE HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL SIGNIFICANCE OF THE PLACEMENT OF THE HOME OF MRS. ANNETTE MYERS AT AMERICAN BEACH ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES

WHEREAS, American Beach was founded in 1935 and is the first stop on Florida's Black Heritage Trail; and

WHEREAS, the "Hippard House", located at 5406 Ervin Street,
American Beach, was built in 1938; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Annette Myers purchased the home in 1961 and has maintained the historic significance of the residence; and

WHEREAS, the home of Mrs. Annette Myers is now listed on the National Register of Historic Places as of October 12, 2001.
