## RESOLUTION 2005 - 142

A RESOLUTION DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AS TO WORK REQUIRED TO ADDRESS "BLACK MOLD" IN THE HISTORIC COURTHOUSE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has been advised by staff that "black mold" exists in certain areas of the Historic Courthouse; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has received information from staff and from the Nassau County Health Department; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has also received information from OHC Environmental, a company that specializes in mold remediation; and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney, the County Administrator, the Director of Building Maintenance, and Wade Sparkman have met with Judge Brian Davis; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds, based upon the data provided and staff opinions, that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Nassau County that an emergency be declared, and that the mold be immediately addressed for the operation of the Court system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 26th day of September, 2005, by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, that:

1. The eradication and/or removal of the "black mold" in the Historic Courthouse is declared to be an emergency.

2. The County Administrator shall schedule a meeting with the County Attorney, the Building Maintenance Director, a representative from the contractor, a representative from the architect, and a representative from OHC.

3. The County Administrator is hereby authorized to proceed, pursuant to the emergency, to address the "black mold" at the Historic Courthouse.

4. The County Administrator is hereby directed to keep Judge Foster, Judge Davis, and the Constitutional Officers apprised of the status of the work.

5. Any proposed expenditure pursuant to the emergency shall be approved by the Board of County Commissioners before the work is directed to proceed.
