

RESOLUTION NO. 2006-123

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, REGARDING LIMITED
QUOTA PACKAGE STORE LIQUOR LICENSES

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 644 was passed in 1981 and provided that no license which may be granted for the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be issued in Nassau County so that the number of such licenses within the limits of the territory exceeds one such license to each 4,000 residents within Nassau County; and

WHEREAS, in the year 2000 legislation was changed to increase the population limit to 7,500 for every other county in the State of Florida, except Nassau County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida finds that the restriction of one license per 4,000 residents should be increased to 7,500 residents in order to be consistent with the other counties within the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds no basis for Nassau County to have more licenses than other counties.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 23rd day of August, 2006 by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida:


