This honor recognizes Mr. Page's numerous contributions to the citizens of Nassau County as a community builder, mentor and trusted elected official.


For more than 32 years Mr. Page, a Nassau Native, made fundamental contributions in the field of government where he served our citizens with favor and distinction.

James S. Page Governmental Complex.




