RESOLUTION NO. 2010-89

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE DESIGNATION OF OFFICIAL USE ONLY VEHICLES, PURSUANT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2002-31

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2002-31, as amended, adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, on May 20, 2002, established permits for driving or parking on the beaches within the unincorporated areas of Nassau County; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2002-31, as amended, further provided that four-wheelers and all-terrain vehicles (ATV), except for official use only vehicles as approved by the Board of County Commissioners and designated accordingly by the Board, are prohibited on the County's beach areas; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has received a request from The Ritz-Carlton to designate two (2) motorized vehicles for official use only in order to maintain and set up beach rentals including towels, beach chairs and umbrellas. Said motorized vehicles shall have access onto the beach area through Scott Road and shall be able to traverse the beach to the said beach front area for the beach rentals located in front of the Ritz Carlton Hotel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this <u>26th</u> day of April, 2010 by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, as follows:

 The Board, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2002-31, hereby designates two (2) motorized vehicles as

official-use-only vehicles in order to maintain and set up beach rentals including towels, beach chairs and umbrellas. Said motorized vehicles shall have access onto the beach area through Scott Road and shall be able to traverse the beach to the said beach front area for the beach rentals located in front of the Ritz Carlton Hotel.

- 2. All other provisions of Ordinance No. 2002-31, as amended, shall be adhered to and remain in full force and effect.
- A copy of this Resolution shall be provided to the Nassau County Sheriff.
