

**RESOLUTION NO. 2016-152**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
EXTENDING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY IN NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA  
DUE TO HURRICANE MATTHEW**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida adopted Resolution No. 2016-143 on October 12, 2016 extending the state of local emergency in Nassau County, Florida, due to Hurricane Matthew; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners exercised its authority under Chapter 252.38(3), Florida Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 252.38(3)(5) provides that the duration of the state of emergency declared locally is seven (7) days; and


**WHEREAS**, the seven day increment may be extended by a majority vote of the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, as a result of Hurricane Matthew's landfall, the County continues to address damage to areas within the County, including the assessment of damage, and there exists a need to extend this local State of Emergency to facilitate measures to protect citizens, visitors and property.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, this 25th day of October, 2016 as follows:


The Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida does hereby extend the State of Local Emergency for an additional seven day period through November 1, 2016 due to damage associated with Hurricane Matthew in areas within the county and the assessment of damage and provisions to address the damage.




