A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS EXTENDING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY IN NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA DUE TO HURRICANE IRMA

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida adopted Resolution No. 2017-128 on September 6, 2017 declaring a state of local emergency in Nassau County, Florida, due to Hurricane Irma; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners exercised its authority under Chapter 252.38(3), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 252.38(3)(5) provides that the duration of the state of emergency declared locally is seven (7) days; and

WHEREAS, the seven day increment may be extended by a majority vote of the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, as a result of Hurricane Irma's landfall, the County continues to address flooding and damage to areas within the County, and there exists a need to extend this local State of Emergency to facilitate measures to protect citizens, visitors and property.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, this 23rd day of October, 2017 as follows:

The Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida does hereby extend the State of Local Emergency for an additional seven day period through October 31, 2017 due to on-going flooding conditions and damage associated with Hurricane Irma in areas within the county.
