

**RESOLUTION NO. 2024-128**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
EXTENDING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY IN NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA  
DUE TO TROPICAL STORM DEBBY**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida adopted Resolution No. 2024-123 on August 5, 2024 declaring a state of local emergency in Nassau County, Florida, due to Tropical Storm Debby; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners exercised its authority under Chapter 252.38(3), Florida Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 252.38(3)(5) provides that the duration of the state of emergency declared locally is seven (7) days; and


**WHEREAS**, the seven (7) day increment may be extended by a majority vote of the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, as a result of Tropical Storm Debby's landfall, the County continues to address flooding and damage to areas within the County, and there exists a need to extend this local State of Emergency to facilitate measures to protect citizens, visitors and property.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, this 12th day of August, 2024 as follows:




