#### CHANGE ORDER

#### INSTRUCTIONS

#### A. GENERAL INFORMATION

This document was developed to provide a uniform format for handling contract changes that affect Contract Price or Contract Times. Changes that have been initiated by a Work Change Directive must be incorporated into a subsequent Change Order if they affect Contract Price or Times.

Changes that affect Contract Price or Contract Times should be promptly covered by a Change Order. The practice of accumulating change order items to reduce the administrative burden may lead to unnecessary disputes.

If Milestones have been listed, any effect of a Change Order, thereon, should be addressed.


For supplemental instructions and minor changes not involving a change in the Contract Price or Contract Times, a Field Order may be used.

#### B. COMPLETING THE CHANGE ORDER FORM

Engineer / Architect / Etc. initiates the form, including a description of the changes involved and attachments based upon documents and proposals submitted by Contractor, or requests from the County or both.

Once Engineer / Architect / Etc. has completed and signed the form, all copies should be sent to Contractor for approval. After approval by Contractor, all copies should be sent to the County for approval. Engineer should make distribution of executed copies after approval by the County.

If a change only applies to Contract Price or to Contract Times, cross out the part of the tabulation that does not apply.

Dear Mr. Johnson:

The County has reviewed your letter dated October 8, 2012 responding to our offer to settle these claims. The Contract includes unit prices for the materials that were used for the repair work. However, there were materials that were not included in the Contract at unit prices that we agree to compensate Comanco for labor and equipment associated with their installation and for repair work in Zone 1.

Please note that Section 12.01.B. states that, "The value of any Work covered by a Change Order or of any Claim for an adjustment in Contract Price will be determined as follows: 1. where the Work involved is covered by unit prices contained in the Contract Documents, by application of such unit prices to the quantities of the items involved. The two tables below detail the assessment of Comanco's costs based on unit prices in the contract.
