ORDINANCE NO. 73 -25

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4 - 1 (a) OF THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES, COUNTY OF NASSAU, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL OF THE RESTRICTION OF ONE LICENSE FOR EACH FIVE HUNDRED (500) PERSONS AND INSERTING THE RESTRICTION THAT THE PLACE OF BUSINESS OF THE VENDOR MUST HAVE A WORTH OF FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000.00), SEATING CAPACITY MUST BE FOR A MINIMUM OF SEVENTY-FIVE PATRONS AND THE SALES OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE PLACE OF BUSINESS SHALL NOT EXCEED THIRTY PERCENT (30%) OF GROSS SALES OF FOOD AND BEVERAGES COMBINED -PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

SECTION 4 - 1. Wine and Beer vendors licenses limited.

(a) The number of licenses which may be granted for the sale of intoxicating beverages (as defined by "THE FLORIDA BEVERAGE LAW") outside of any incorporated city or town, within Nassau County, to vendors operating places of business where beverages containing alcohol of fourteen per cent (14%) or less by weight are sold, is limited to only those vendors making new application after the enactment date of this ordinance who shall meet the following requirements:

(1) The place of business of the Vendor shall have an assessed value of a minimum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).

(2) The seating capacity of the place of business of the Vendor shall be for a minimum of seventy-five (75) patrons.

(3) The sale of alcoholic beverages shall not exceed thirty percent (30%) of Gross Sales of the combined sale of Food and Beverages. Such percentage shall be established by sworn affidavit of the licensee with all records being subject to audit by Nassau County Commission.

(4) The license issued hereunder is not transferable without approval of County Commission of Nassau County.

The provisions of this ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 1973.
