RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
FOR NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, The Citizens of Nassau County, Florida rely upon the Television Industry as a major source of information and entertainment; and

WHEREAS, there is an increasing trend towards the use of violence and the exploitation of sex in the programming of said Television Industry; and

WHEREAS, there is an increasing trend toward the commercialization through the television media of products relating to contraceptive devices and feminine hygiene; and

WHEREAS, such programming and commercialization has a profound effect upon the Citizens of Nassau County, Florida, and especially the children of Nassau County, Florida.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida:

SECTION ONE

That by this Resolution, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida requests and urges that the Federal Communications Commission hold public hearings throughout the country to determine whether the Citizens of the United States effected by the programming and commercialization heretofore described desire a reversal of the trends mentioned above.
