## RESOLUTION 87 - 54

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE FOURTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT, THE HONORABLE JOHN E. SANTORA, JR., PROVIDE A CIRCUIT JUDGE IN NASSAU COUNTY FOR A MINIMUM OF FOUR (4) DAYS PER WEEK AS OPPOSED TO THE CURRENT THREE (3) DAYS PER WEEK.

WHEREAS, the case load in Nassau County has reached a level whereby a Circuit Judge is required a minimum of four (4) days per week; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to the requests of the Chief Judge, renovated the Circuit Judge's Chambers in order to provide more adequate Chambers for said Judge in anticipation of a Judge on a full-time basis; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has made several requests for a full-time Circuit Judge; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has been advised by the local Bar Association of the need for a Judge four (4) days a week; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has been made aware of the length of time during which cases are now being set, and said length of time is creating an extreme burden on the residents of Nassau County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners this <u>28th</u> day of July, 1987, that they hereby formally request of the Chief Judge, the Honorable John E. Santora, Jr., that he provide, at a minimum, a Circuit Judge for Nassau County for four (4) days each and every week.
