WHEREAS the General Trust Fund has received proceeds from the refinancing of the Housing Finance Authority bond issue. On May 11, 1992 the Board of County Commissioners approved an allocation of \$100,000 to each commissioner district to be used for recreational impact purposes.

WHEREAS these revenues were not anticipated in the 1991/92 budget for the General Fund.
